

hood of Leipfick, confift of 20 Squadrons, 8 Troops of Uhlans, 18 Battalions, and their Artillery of 26 Field Pieces, 6 Cannon, and 2 Pieces of Ordnance called Haubitzen. The Pruffians are encamped on a Plain at a fmall Distance from Halle, and their Troops can be eafily defcried from a little Eminence contiguous to the Saxon Camp. The Sicknefs among the Cattle ftill continues, and is in the Suburbs of this City.

Berlin, June 23, N. S. By the laft Letters from our Army in Silefia they were fo near the Allies, that we are in hourly Expectation of another Battle. M. Schmettau has been recalled from his Banifhment at Brandenbourg, but it is not yet faid that he has had any Command conferr'd upon him.

From the Camp of M. Bathiani at Wechtersbach, June 25. The firft Column of Marshal Traun's Army, confifting of three Regiments of Horfe, 13 Battalions, 2 Companies of Grenadiers, and 1000 Conftadians, joined us the Day before Yefterday, under the Command of the Prince of Birkenfeldt. The fecond under that of M. Bernklau, confifting of two Regiments of Horfe, 14 Battalions, and nine Companies of Grenadiers is come up To-day. The third, with the Marshal, confifts of four Regiments of Horfe, 15 Battalions, 12 Companies of Grenadiers, and 2000 Croats, and is to arrive after To-morrow. The Corps of General Tripps confifts in three Regiments of Huffars, and 2000 Croats, and has Orders to ftay on the other Side the Mayn about Millenberg, to amufe and harrafs the Enemy until the entire Junction is perfected. The Marshal has befides 2000 Foot on their Way from Ingoldftadt, who ought not to be above five Days March off. By Letters from the Mayn, Prince Conti was ftill encamped with the main Body of his Army between Seiligenftadt and Diepurg, whilft M. de la Fare and de la Motte were pofted with two other feparate Bodies higher up that River. His whole Army was reckoned to be near 50,000 ftiong.

Venice, June 11, N. S. The Austrian Army in Italy was to decamp from Fiorenzula the 9th Inftant, to advance nearer to the King of Sardinia, keeping Tortona on their Right. They have lately received feveral Reinforcements, and are computed to be 25000 effective Men. M. Schulemberg will reach the Army on Monday next, the 14th Inftant, when Prince Lobkowitz will refign the Command to him. The King of Sardinia's chief Camp is between Tortona and Serravalle; the reft of his Troops are canton'd fo as to form a Cordon that guards the Paffes of the Mountains. Marshal

Maillebois arrived at Nice the 23th of laft Month, and immediately a Council was held, at which Don Philip was prefent. The next Day eight Squadrons began their March, and the reft of the Cavalry was to follow fucceffively by like Detachments. Don Philip left Nice the 1ft Inftant, and was to proceed along the Riviera by flow Journeys. M. de Gages continues ftill in the Neighbourhood of the City of Genoa, where they have fuffered much from a Scarcity of Provisions, but they have been lately relieved by the Arrival of fome Veffels laden with Corn from Civita Vecchia. There are alfo arrived three Veffels of the Imbarkation from Naples, with Artillery and Ammunition. It is faid they will not be able to open the Campaign before the End of this Month. General Pallavicini paffed by here on Tuefday laft in his Way to Milan.

Hague, June 25, N. S. The States have ordered all their Battalions in the Field to be compleated to 750 Men, by Draughts out of the Refidue left at Home or in Garrifon, of the refpective Regiments.

Hague, June 29, N. S. Major General Brakel, late Commandant of the Cittadel of Tournay, arrived here laft Night from Ghent, and was to make his Report to their High Mightineffes as To-day. Lord Tynawley fet out for England the Day before Yefterday, and Chevalier Oforio this Morning for Hanover. Count Podewils, the Pruffian Minifter here, has prefented his Letters of Revocation, and received his Recredentials; but is not yet fet out.

Whitehall, June 22.

The King has been pleafed to conftitute and appoint the Right Honourable John Earl of Dunmore, General of his Majesty's Foot Forces, to be Captain and Governor of Plymouth.
