Lisbon, July 3. On the 71th paft, N.S. Vice-Admiral Rowley appear'd with his Britannick Majesty's Ships off Fato. The Toulon, Squadron was not returned to the Bay tof Gadiz the 5th Inflant, 27 hree Register Ships, which were expected from Vera Cruz, are got into the Bay of Cadiz. They called at the Havanna, and came all from thence, with two more which have not yet appeared. The Money brought by these three Ships is only 70,000 Pieces of (Price Two-pence.)
