The Hercules and Jason, by Reason of the little Breeze and their Diftance, could not in Time come to the Dauphin's Aid, and jointly from the Pres. attack the 50 Gun Ship, while the other could not for fome Time fteer, which Circumstance it is faid might have given Occasion to the Hercules to escape, failing better than the rest; after a brave Refistance they were forced to strike; then the Commodore fent Officers and Men to take Possessing the French Officers on board his Ship, where he received them like a gallant generous Officer, flewing them all the Favour and Friendship depending on him, and usual in such Cases; the like good Treatment received the reft of the Gentlemen fent on board the Prefton, Lord Northesk.

The St. Louis, Captain Johannes, laden from Canton and bound to Mauritius, was taken fome Days afterwards by Captain Cumming in a Privatier of 30 Guns from England. The two Chief Supra Cargos, Meffieurs Margrin and La Val, with the three fecond Captains, and two Officers, were, by Order. of the Commodere, put on Board the English China Ships, and the reft, with the Ships, carried to Batavia. The other two Ships in their way to the Streights of Malacca called at Achin, where they found a French Privatier, fitted out and fent by the Company to cruize in the China Seas; they carried her with them through the Streights of Malacca, and in the Way took a French Ship from Manilla, faid to be rich. When we came through the Streights of Banca, these two Ships were lying with the two Prizes difguifed like their Conforts who took the three French China Men, of which they had no Account, but being told by us, that the French Ships had left Canton long before us, they thereupon refolved to go to their Rendezvous at Batavia.
