PRESENT,

The Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council.

HEREAS for the more speedy Augmentation of His Majesty's Forces for suppressing the present Rebellion, His Majesty was pleased, on the 5th Day of October last, to issue His Royal Proclamation, thereby promising and declaring, That all such able-bodied Men, who should in lift themselves as Soldiers in his Land Service on or before the 25th Day of December next, should, upon their Request, be discharged therefrom at the End of Six Months from the respective Times of their Inlisting, in Case the faid Rebellion should be extinguished within that Time, and if not, then as soon as the said Rebellion should be extinguished. And whereas the Time thereby limited for such Inlisting is now near expiring, and that the Continuance of the Rebellion renders it still necessary to make such further Augmentation of his Majesty's Forces, as may most effectually serve to put an End to the said Rebellion: It is therefore his Majesty's Pleafure, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the faid Time of Inlifting be extended from the 25th of this Instant December, to the 25th of March next enfuing; and all fuch able bodied Men, who shall inhst themselves as Soldiers in his Majesty's Land Service, on or before the said 25th Day of March next, shall, upon their Request, be discharged therefrom at the End of Six Months from the respective Times of their Inlisting, in case the said Rebellion shall be extinguished within that Time, and if not, then as soon as the faid Rebellion shall be extinguished, according to the Terms of the aforesaid Proclamation.

Petersbourg, November 16. Her Imperial Majesty has nominated M. Nepleost to succeed M. Wisniakoff, deceased, as her Minister to Constantinople. Prince Augustus of Holitein is declared Administrator of that Dutchy. The 12,000 Men, which the Empress has granted to the Assistance of the King of Poland Elector of Saxony, have all passed the Duna, and are now in Courland.

AT the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, the Month his Majesty's Ship the Dover, with the Transports and Storeships under the Transports and Sto rived here, and the two Regiments were embarked here the 28th for Louisbourg. Admiral Medley is here with the Squadron under his Command. .

Naples, Nov. 30. On the 24th Instant, at Three in the Morning, her Sicilian Majesty was safely deliver'd of a Princess, who was immediately baptized by the Name of Maria Louisa, and is the fifth Infanta born, of which Number the two first dyed.

Rome, Dec. 4. The Secretary of State has receiv'd by an Estasette from Ancona, an Act count of the Decease of Cardinal Massei, Bishop

of that City, on the 25th past.

Leghorn, Dec. 6. Captain Townshend sailed from this Place the 3d Instant, with Part of the Squadron of his Britannick Majesty's Ships under his Command, for Corlica. The Day before his Departure he received Advice from thence, that the Corficans had taken the Town of San Fiorenzo, and it was expected they would soon make themselves Masters of the Castle, being a Place of not much Strength, and but ill provided with Necessaries. A Body of 5000 Men was marched to blockade Calvi, and two other strong Detachments were gone with the same Design to Ajaccio and Bonifaccio... Captain Townshend has left behind him the Bomb-Veffels to be repaired, which is doing with the utmost Dispatch.

Prague, Dec. 9. It is said that Prince Lobcowitz with his Column will arrive To-day at Pirna, as will Prince Charles with the rest of his Army at Leitmeritz; and Marshal Traum is on his March towards Saxony with a large Detachment; and that the Russians continue to advance towards the Prussian Territories.

Prague, Dec. 11, N. S. Prince Charles may be in Saxony this Day. His Army must receive its Subsistance from this Kingdom, which is likewise settling the Manner of levying twelve or thirteen Thousand Recruits that the House of Austria is raising for next Year. It is said his Prussian Majesty demands 150,000 Rixdollars of each Circle in Saxony, and 238,000 a Month of Lusatia, besides Provisions. Here is certain Advice, that the Prussian General Winterfeld, with a Corps of about 10,000 Men, has driven Field Marshal Hohenembs with that under his Command out of Silesia quite to Jaromirz.
