He Sieur de Paqto is gone to Vionna, fo .. complement their Imperial Majefties on the part of the Queen upon their marsiage. The Grand Mareschal Sobietski having put his Troops into their Winter Quarters, is come ro Lemburgh, where he intends' to relide this Winter, to be near at hand on all occasions. The Archbishop of Gnefna having received his Holinefs Bulls for his Confirmation, together with his Pallium, will now take upon him the Administration of Matters, during the inter Regnum. The Sieur Radziewskz is appointed to go to Rome, and to carry his Holinels the Standaert, which was raken from Huffaine Baffa, under the Walls of Cochim. We have advice, that a Pestilentious Diftemper is got amongh our Army, and that many have died of it; fo that our Forces are very confiderably. The difcourfe is various concerning the weakned. Candidates to the Crown, though, as yet, we cannot -determine, whofe pre:ences are most likely to fucceed ; the perfons concerned, in the mean time omit no endeavors to ftrengthen their Intereft, though the time being fo thort, they have lefs leafure to make their par-

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ties, to the prejudice of a free Election. Ditto. The Grand Marefeltal Subjective hath written to acquaint the Senate, that he hath received advice from the Weywoode of Braklaw, who commands the Forces' that lay quartered round about Gaminice, and befet that place, that the Turks there, begin to be for much fraightned for Provisions, that ten Companies were marched out; but that the faid Weywoode; upon notice of it, drew part of his Forces together to charge them, and being come very near to the Turks, they to avoid the engagement, returned to Caminice, where they languish extreamly for want of Victuals; fo that we are in great hopes they will be reduced to furrender the place.

Naples, Decemb. 19. On Wednelday last was published here, by found of Trumpet, an Order of our Viceroys, That all the French shall quirthis City.in ten days, and this Kingdom in the space of a Moneth, at farthest, on pain of being afterwards treated with the utmost rigor. The faid Order has been sent to all places within this Kingdom, ro be likewise published there, that none may pretend ignorance. Our Viceroy hath been for some days pass, extream ill, not without some danger, though at present he begins to mend. His Excellency hath received directions from the Court at Madrid, to transport all the Italian Forces, lately railed, into Gatalonia, and only expects the arrival of Three Vesses, the Crown of Spain proposes to bring a considerable Army on foot to act against the French.

Rome, Dec. 23. On Sunday latt Te Deum was fung in the Popes Chappel, in the Quirinal, for the Victory tobtained by the Poles over the Turks; at which, his Holinefs affilted with great vigor. The Pope taking very much to heart the affairs of Poland, and knowing how much infimorts that King om to come to a freedy Election of a new King, kas written very tarnetilly to the Senate to that purpole, propoling to them, as is fuid, the Prince of Lorraine, as a fit perfon to focceed in that Government. The feveral Cardinals have likewile written to the Senators of Poland on this occasion. The Marquels del Carpio is fuddenly expected here in quality of Ambaffador Extraordinary from Spath. From Genous we have advice, That at Nolis a place belonging to that State, feituate between Final and Suond, had been difeovered a 'very dangerous configracy againft' the Government, that feveral eminion perfons hadbeen arrefted and brought prifonels to that frates of that place.

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Venice, Dec. 30. Our Letters from Conflantinopla tell us, That the Plague which hath been there very violent for feveral Moneths paft, to the definition of 130000 Men, Women; and Children, begins now fa fome measure to decrease: That the affairs of the Court, feen at prefent, very much perplexed, oceahoned by the defeat of their Army under the conditand of Hussiane Bassa, the defection of Woldavia and Wallachia thereupon, and the Plague which rages at home to that degree, that they cannot bing their Troops together, without great danger of losing their all, before they can come to march against the Enemys. We have advice from Hangary, that the Rebels in that Country, being affogether diffueattned, and not able to expect any fuccors from the Port, as things fhand there, have refolved to except the Pardon offered them by the Emperor, and to lay down their Arms.

Vienna, Dec. 24. This day the Count de Monte. enculi arrived here, and is to affit at the Council of War, which the Emperor has refolved to hold, after which, we may hear what refolution hath been taken concerning his return to the Army. Yefferday the Count d'Oeitingen arrived from Warfim, where he hath been to condole with the Queen ; and the Count de Shafigore is ready to depart thither with the quality of Ambaffador Extraordinary to affift at the Election. From Buda we have advice of a Turkish Envoy, who is on his way hither, to give the Emperor new Affuránces of the conflant refolution of the Grand Signior, to maintain the present peace inviolable, as likewise to pray his Imperial Majefty not to give the Poles any affistance. Here is a report spred abroad, That in the late battle of Cochim, the Poles took prifoner the Son of the Grand Visier,

Coblentz, Jan. 10. The old Duke of Lerraine is now here, and very busie about making of new Levies to reinforce the Troops he has already on foor. The Marquefs de Bareystraifes in these parts two Regiments for the Emperor. The Paltz graef Lodowick Hendrick of Simmeren, is dead without Children, fo that his Effate comes to the Elector Palatine. The French have possible themselves of Sarbruck on the Saar, and have carried the Couar de Nassaw, Lord of that place, to Merg. From Vienna we have advice, that the new Levies proceed there with the greatest diligence possible.

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Acrnhem, Jan. 2. Some days paft, was brought bipter, three Eurger-Mafters, and eight Eurgers of Campen, as likewife, one Eurger-Mafter, a Minister, and two Eurgers of Elbourg, as Holiages for the payment of the Moneys profinited by those two places, opon the French quitting of them. The twenty ninth paft arrived here fome Troops of the Garifon which was in *Campen*, and feveral other Troops, have there days paits, marched towards Nimmegen. The Bifhop of Manifer has caufed feveral pieces of Artillery, and good quantity of Ammunition, to be brought to Goefocht, intending to fortific that place's where he will for the future redides, The Marcfelal d'Humieres has been here, and having wifted our Fortifications, and given all neceffaity Greders, is parted for We fel. We are raifing fe twendy new Ourworks to make this place, the more confiderable; having, to that end, cut down all the Trees, and pulled down the House, that flood in the Neighborbood.: The reports of the Bifloop of Munifers, having concluded an Accord with the Emperor, proves without

any truth. Hague, Jan. 12. The ninth inftam the Prince of Orange accompanied by the young Prince of Courland, and some others of the Principal Officers of the Army, arrived here, having brought the Army into the May ery of the Bosch, where they have fince separated, and are gone into their Winter Quarters His Highness , has received the Compliments of the Foreign Minilters, and all the persons of note here, upon his fafe return. The States have issued a Placaet, by which they forbid the great and little Fishery for the enfuing year ; as likewife the Greenland Fithery, and all other Foreign Navigation, to be accompted from the Tenth of March nest ; othe States having observed that many Seamen go daily into the Service of the Danes, Smides, and Oftenders, have published another Placet to recal them home, on very fevere genalties, in cafe they refuse fo to do. The affairs of Utrecht, remain, as yes, altogether unsettled; nor are the Magistrates of the place, as yet, slected; but the Government of things there, is put into the hands of fome perfons appointed by the States General, for the present only. It is faid, that the Prince of Orange willmake a flep thither to compose Matters, The French having quities Gamben, Colonel Golfein was ordered to march into the place with 1400 Men, and is made Governor of the place. We are told, That the States have refolved to use all endeavors to renew their late Treaty with the Elector of Brandenburgh, they being willing to allow him the fame Subfidies as formerly ; but it is thought his E-lectoral Highnefs is already engaged with the Crown of Sweden, to endeavor the refloring of Peace ; and befides, that he too well remembers how backward thefe States were in the performance of what was flipulated by the late Treaty, to enter into any new engage-ment with them. The tenth inftant arrived here Count Waldcok, though he will not flay here long.

Bruffels, Fun. 12. In our lait we gave you an account of the Count de Monterey his return hither from the Army, and that the Troops were all gone into their Winter Quarters: That the French were bringing a great Body of Men together, to be commanded by the Prince of Conde, with whom is to joyn Monfieur de Laxemburgh with his Troops. All we can add at prefert, is, That our Governor feems wholly intent upon the War, which he will profecute with all the vigor poffible on his fide; and we hope the Emperor will do the like on his; accordingly we talk of nothing but of new Levies, and of other preparations for War. The Dutch feem fomewhat troubled, that the advices from Spain do not answer their wishes; for contrary to

what they have reported, those I effers fells us That the Queen of Spain has hitherto refused to ratifie the feparate Articles of the late Treaty concluded with the States General, which feemed particularly to concern the Crown of Englands, and that there was little likelihood her Majetty would, having on feveral occasions declared her refolution to maintain the Peace with His Majetty of Great Britain. Our Letters from Paris tell us, That the Prince of Conde was fet out from thence to go and command the Kings Forces, but what particular defign he has in hand, we do not yet learns That His Majetty had permitted a Free Trade, each Veffel paying fo much per Tun; and that the new Levies in that Kingdom were on a Opere.

that Kingdom were on achace. Earn, Jan. 12. The King in confideration of the great Services performed by the Sieur d'Aligor, having in April 1672. committed to his charge so the keeping. of his Great Seal, has now as a farther mark of his favor to him, been pleafed to make him Chancellor of France. From Bruffels of the fixth initiant, they write, That the Duke of Luxemburgh not having thought fit to march towards Treves, be caufe it would have very much incommoded his Army continued ftill with the Forces under his Command in the Neighborhood of Maestricht ;' that in the interim, the Dutch and S anish Troops were returned home, and gone into their Winter Quarters. From Treves our Letters tell us, that the Count de Vignory, Governor of that place, continues to make feveral excutions into the Enternies Territories, and to do them great detriment. This week the Prince of Conde parted hence, accompanied with the Duke d'Enguien his Son, towards Flanders, to commandihis Majetties Forces in those parts. . The King has given the Government of Champagne, and of Brie, void by the death of the Count de Soiffons, to the Count de Vivonne, General of the Gallies of France.

Ditto, Jan. 13. The eleventh inflant the Prince of Conde went hence towards Avefnes, where is appointed to be a Rendefvous of Ten thousand Horfe, of the Kings Houfe, and of as many Foot; but the King having fince, received advice, That the Dutch and Spanish Troops are returned home to go into their Winter Quarters, it is faid the Prince will have Orders to come back, and in the mean time, Monfieur de Turenne is not to go hence till he hath farther directions for it from his Majefty, although his Baggage is already on the way. The Duke of Claunes is expected here this day, and kence he proceeds again for ologne. The Coune de Vivenne is defigned to command a fliong Squadron of Men of War, joyned with Galleys this Summer in the Mediterranean.
