THE military Preparations here are still continued with great Vigour. By the First of March there will be Fifty Thousand effective Men ready to take the Field, and as many more by the Beginning of June.

Florence, Feb. 1, N. S. By Letters from Rome, received this Morning, there are Accounts, that Embarkations of Recruits, Ammunition and Stores, are continually seen to pass by the Roman Coasts for Genoa; Recruits are raising all over the Ecclesiastical State, and even in the City of Rome, and they are sent to Civita Vecchia, to a Country House of the Spanish Consul, till a sufficient Number is got together to be embarked. The Spanish Agents buy up all the Corn and other Grain they can get, in order to transport it likewise to Genoa. The Regency has received Notice, that the Republick of Genoa had given Orders to M. Papperini, the Emperor's Agent there, to leave their State in three Days, without telling the Motive of that Order; Notice thereof sent this Evening to Vienna. The Pope has sent Signor Marco Fufarelli to Naples, to settle, with the Ministers of that Court, the necessary Quarters, &c. for the Corps of Neapolitan Troops which is to pass through the Ecclesiastick State in its March to the Infant's Army in Lombardy. The Legate of Ferrara has informed the Pope, that some Imperial Troops have entered the Ferrarese. The Spaniards have a large Magazine at Bologna, and have sent several Pieces of Cannon to Parma, with an Intent, as they give out, to besiege the Castles of Modena and Mirandola, in order to have a free Communication with the Ecclesiastick State. They are at present posted at Guastalla and St. Benedetto, and are making Dispositions to prevent the Imperial Army, expected from Gerthany, from passing the Po.

Berlin, Feb. 12, N. S. The latter End of this Month his Prussian Majesty will go, as is said, into Silesia, and from thence, in the Month of May, into the Dutchy of Cleves. Yesterday the Palatin Minister, Baron Bechers, set out for Dresden: Upon his Return hither he will set out for Vienna. The Minister of Hesse Cassel, M. D'Assebours, returned Yesterday to his own Court.

Antwerp, Feb. 17, N. S. By Letters from Brussels received this Day, we have Accounts, that the Town made a vigorous Defence, and that the Burghers behaved to Admiration. The Deserters from the French Army report, that the Garrison had made two Sallies with Success, and that the Fire from the Besieged did more Execution than that of the Besiegers, who had not yet erected any Battery for Mortars; and that great Numbers of Sick were daily sent from their Army to Ghent. The first Division of the Austrian Troops joined the Prince of Waldeck's Corps Yesterday.

Hague, Feb. 18. The Letters of Yesterday from Antwerp bring no new Particulars of the Progress of the French before Brussels, and only say, that the Garrison continued to make a gallant Defence. This Morning the States General regulated and settled the Command and Repartition of their Forces for the current Year. It is reported here, that Fitz James's and Ruth's Regiments had been embarked at Ostend, and a French one at Dunkirk, for Scotland; but are all said to be relanded again.

An Act for establishing an Agreement with the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, for cancelling certain Exchequer Bills, upon the Terms therein mentioned; and for obliging them to advance the Sum of One Million upon the Credit of the Land Tax and Malt Duties granted to his Majesty for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and forty six.

An Act for adjourning the Court of Session in Scotland, and for remedying the Inconveniencies arising from the Surcease of Justice in that Part of the Kingdom.

An Act to enable his Majesty to make Rules, Orders and Regulations, more effectually to prevent the spreading of the Distemper which now rages amongst the horned Cattle in this Kingdom.
