CHARLES R.

Hereas Our moft Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in this pre-fent Parliament Affembled, have befought. Lis, That we would be graciously pleased to Islue our Our Royal Proclamation, thereby Requiring all Papists, or reputed Papists, who now are, or remain within five miles of Our Cities of London and westremain within five miles of Our Cities of London and West-migher, or Our Burrough of Southwark, not being Houshof-ders, nor attending any Peer of this Realmas a Menial Ser-want, to repair to their respective dwellings, or to depart Ten miles from the Cities and Burrough aforesaid, and not to re-turn during this Session of Parliament. Provided, That it may be permitted for any Papsis, or reputed Papsis, to re-turn unto the Cities or Burrough aforesaid, who shall first op-tain a Licence therefore under the Hands of any six of the Lords of Our Privy Gouncil; and that We would be pleased to give order to the Quarter Sessions, That they give in unto Us an account of what Housholders now are within the Ci-ties or Burrough aforesaid, and five miles thereof, who are of that Protession; and that the Quarter Sessions do Adjourn of that Profession; and that the Quarter Sessions do Adjourn of that Profession; and that the Quarter Sessions do Adjourn themselves from time to time for that purpose. Which Address of theirs We have seriously considered, and do with much contenement and satisfaction accept; And as We have always manifested Our Zeal for the preservation of the true Religion established in this Kingdom, and to hinder the growth and energia of the Popish Religion, so We are now ready upon this occasion to prevent all fears and D ingers that may arise by the concourse of persons of that Prosession, in or near Our Cities of London or West minster. Provided always, That this Our Proclamation shall not extend to prohibit any Panish, or reputed Panish, from returning unto the Prices. That this Our Proclamation shall not extend to prohibit any Papis, or reputed Papist, from returning unto the Cities or Burrough aforesaid, who shall sink obtain Licence therefore under the Hands of any six of the Lords of Our Privy Council. And We do hereby surther Charge and Command Our susties, and for Our server of Lordon and Wishmister, and for Our serveral Counties of Middlesex, Suppey, Kent, and Esex, that at their next Quarter Sessions to be kolden for the said respective Cities and Counties, they make diligent enquiry within their respective jurisdictions, and give in unto Us an account of what Housholders now are within the Cities or Burrough aforesaid, or within sive miles thereof, who are of that profession; And that they do easile the said Quarter Sessions to be Adjourned from time to time for that purpose, as occasion shall require.

Vienna, Hing. The third instant arrived here an Amballador from the Cham of Tartary, with a Fraih of about to persons; though as yet we are ignorant of the occasional his coming of the Emperor having refolved to maile feveral thouland Men against Spring, the Commissions are daily giving out; and in the mean time 400000 Crowns have been remitted hicher from Sprinfor the carrying on the Levies that are to be made here for the service of that Crown. The Troops that were quartered on the Frontiers of Hungary are now on their march towards Bavaria, but as yet the Emperor hathnot appointed a perion to Command them in chief, though the Count de Souches, General Cobs, and the Count of Herberstein are in nomination. It is reported that the Count de Sirowitz has underraken to raise 3000 Croats for the service of his Imperial Majefty. In some days we expect here Prince Charles of Lorrain, for whose Promotion to the Crown of rolland this Court labors with much earnestness, having obliged the faid Prince, in case he succeed in his prevenees, to marry the Queen Dowager.

Nurenberg, Jun. 9. The fith instant arrived here Prince Charles of Lorrain, and without making any stay here, continued his journey towards Vienna, whether heahemore hastens, forthar the election in Po-

land is near at hand.

Francisca, Jan. 9. The young Prince of Sakory advances with flow marches towards these parts with the Troops, defigned Auxiliaries to the Emperor, being counted about 4000 Men; they intend to quarter for several weeks in the Countrey of Fulda, and afterwards to joyn the Imperial Army, according as the Emperor shall appoint; The death of the Duke of Simmere n, who dyed the 24 of the last month at Creutfnach, without issue, is like to beget some difference between the Elector Palatine, Heir and Coulin German to the Duke deceased, and the Elector of Mentz, who pretends to the Baillage of Boekelheim, upon some agreement formerly, made with the Duke of simmeren; but fearing a dispute would arise concerning it, his Electoral Highness ordered some Troops to lye ready, and so soon as they heard that the Duke of simmeren was dead, to take possession of it, which they accordingly did; but the Elector Palatine alledging, that his right is more antient, and that no concession could be made without his consent to his prejudice, he hash caused his Forces to besiege the said place of Bocketheim, and hath brought sour pieces of Cannon before it, to batter it, of which we expect the iffue; though it is faid, the Besieged are already in want of Powder.

Cologne, Jan. 16, Our Letters from Liege tell us, that the Count de Schomberg, and Monsieur de Montal having the 8 instant joyned the Duke of Luxemburgh with 8000 Horse, the day following the said Duke caused his Troops to pass the Meuse at Maestricht and is fince marched towards Charleroy, having till their continued in the Countrey of Liege, to frustrate the Negoriation of the Baron d'Issola at Liege, which was to induce that people to put themselves under the protection of the Emperor; but the faid Baron nor having been

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
