Cologue, Jan. 23. Ostend, Jan. 25. Yesterday came into this Road two Zealand Capers with a French Prize, laden with Sugars from Lisbon; the Prize they have sent for Zealand, but the Capers are victualing anew, to make another voyage before their time is out. Our Spanish Fleet is sailed for Zealand, where they are to lye on the Mlachee till a fair wind, this Road norbeing thought safe for them.
