wing been long in debate, it hath been at last resolved, at the instance of the Prince of Orange in their favor; however, the States of this Province will never consens to part with the Rolls which they have fortified in the Territory of the Province of Unreapt, nor will they of Amsterdam be brought to quit the great Stuyce built by them near Hinderham, for the supplying themselves with Water, though formerly Utrecht always opposed it. The Moneys to be paid by the Inhabitants of that place to the Erench, are now ready, and accordingly the Magniferates have fent to the Intendant Roberts to know in what place he expects to have the Moneys paid. In Amersfort the States have put two thousand Men into Garrison, one Regiment into Wyek te Duerstede, which place our Superiors re-folvero fortify: besides which, Fisteen Regiments of Horie, and two of Dragoons are quartered at Wereight, and in the neighborhood. The places which the French keep still in their Conquests, are very full of Men; at Nimmegen they have Six thouland, at Grave Two thousand, at Aernhem Four thousand, and not many Iels at Zutphen. From Flanders we have advice that the King of Spain has given the Bishoprick of Chent to the Elector of Treves, in confideration of the damages he hath sustained by the French.
