From the Gamp of Taro, April 22, N.S. The Marquig de Castellar retired in the Night between the Igih and 20th Instant from Parma, with all the Forces and Baggage which he could poffibly get together, and took the Road that leads to the Mountains, leaving the reft of his Troops eand his Artillery in the Cittadel of Parma; which General Nadafti being informed of, he immediately purfued M. de Caftellar, and has posted his Forces in Tuch a Manner, that it will be difficult for the Spaniards to escape. After their Retreat, the Cittadel of Parma immediately capitulated, and the Garrison consisting of 500 Men, besides 350 Sick, are made Prifoners of War, being permitted however to retain their Baggage. M. de Castellar's Corps is computed at 5000 Men.

Un, April 29, N. S. Letters which arrived this Morning from Infpruck confirm the foregoing Account, and add, that an Estafette passed there the 25th, in his Way from Italy to Vienna, who gave out, that General Nadasti had attacked and defeated the Body under M. de Castellar, and that of those who had escaped from the Battle, 250 had deferted to the Austrians.

Stair, Lord Rothes, and General Cope's Regiment, arrived fafe here this Morfling at Five of the Clock, and it was hoped would be all difembarked by To-morrow Morning's Tide.

As to the State of his Health, it feems to be pretty much the fame still, without any confiderable Alteration one Way or other. About four Days ago her Royal Highness the Hereditary Princess Louiss was taken ill of the Mealles, which have been to rife here of late; but as they came out very favourably, and are attended with no bad Symptoms, there is good **Reafon to hope that the Danger is already paft.** Hague, May 6, N. S. The Letters from Paris of the 2d Instant mention the French King's being fet out the Night before for Bruffels. Matshal-Bathiani has removed his Head-Quarters to the Right of Mechlin, and drawn the Austrians lower down the Dyle; and it is thought the whole Allied Army will foon encamp all together in Order of Battle, in fome Post the fittest for covering Antwerp, and preferving its Communication with this Country. The Rendezvous of the French Army does not feem yet declared, though fome fay, they have marked out a Camp at Zaventheim before Bruffels. S Rotterdam, May 61 Letter's from Mechlin and Antwerp mention the French King's Arrival a Bruffels on Wednesday Night, and that their Troops were in Motion on severy Side; and fome Letters even fay, that they were advanced near Mechlin.
