*Camp at Terhyde, July 5.* The Hessian Battalions arrived in Camp Yesterday, and they appear to be in good Order; their Cloathing and Recruits will join them soon.

*Rotterdam, July 5, N. S.* The Hessians joined the Allied Army Yesterday. The Vanguard of the Austrian Reinforcement from the Rhine, consisting of all their Light Horse, is arrived at Roermonde.

*Hague, July 1.* We hear that the Empress Queen of Hungary has nominated Marshal Bathiani to succeed Count Kaunitz in the Post of Minister Plenipotentiary for the Government of the Austrian Netherlands.

*Hague, July 5, N. S.* It is said here, that the 20,000 Austrians are to begin to pass the Rhine, as this Day, at Keysersworth, and it is supposed Marshal Bathiani may soon make a Motion towards his Left, to secure their Passage over the Meuse at Venlo, and their Junction with the Allied Army. That of France continues, according to our Advices, quiet in its old Post; and the Siege of Mons does not seem pushed on with any great Ardour. M. Vander Heim, the Pensionary of Holland, finds his Health so much impaired by the Fatigues of his Post, that he has demanded, and obtained Leave of his Masters to make a Tour for six Weeks to Spa, and proposes to set out To-morrow Se'nnight. The States of Holland have appointed M. Secretary Buys to manage in the mean Time, their Affairs in the Generality, and M. S. Gravemoer, as first Noble, will perform the Functions of Pensionary in their Assembly. By our Advices from Paris of the 1st Instant, N. S. the French lost 4000 Men in the late Engagement near Placentia. The Chevalier Broglio, Colonel of the Regiment of Poitou, was killed, as were several other Colonels, and the Marquis de Mirepoix was dangerously wounded. The French Court was in great Consternation, and Orders had been sent to all the Troops in Franche Comte to march forthwith towards Italy. The same Letters mention, that Post Chaises had been ordered to be ready upon the Roads for the Return of the French King to the Army in the Netherlands, which it was supposed would take Place immediately after the Dauphiness was brought to Bed; and that the Brest Squadron put to Sea from Rochelle the 22d past, N. S.
