By our Advices from Paris of the 1st Instant, N.S. the French lost 4000 Men in the late Engagement near Placentia. The Chevalier Broglio, Colonel of the Regiment of Poitou, was killed, as were feseveral other Colonels, and the Marquis de Mirepoix was dangeroufly wounded. The French Court was in great Consternation, and Orders had been sent to all the Troops in Franche Comte to march forthwith towards Italy.
