Berlin, October 1. The King of Pruffia is ftill at Potzdam, where the Anniverfary of the Battle at Sohr in Bohemia, was folemnized Yefterday, in Prefence of all the Generals who commanded in that Engagement. His Majefty is expected to arrive at Charlottenburg Tomorrow, and to come to Town the Day after. The Chief of a Regiment of Huffars Major General Ziethem, and his Lieutenant Colonel Vippach, who commands those five Squadrons which are now in Mecklenburg, have been prefented each of them with a magnificent Sabre by the King.

Hambourg, October 4, N. S. The Bells of the feveral Steeples in this City were rung Yefterday an Hour in the Forenoon, and another in the Afternoon, it being the Day preceding the Interment of his late Danish Majesty; and in the Cathedral was held a Funeral Oration. To Day the like Ceremony of ringing Bells has been observed, and will be again To-morrow for the third and last Day. Count Rash, who had defigned giving an Entertainment upon this Anniversary of his Master the Emperor's Name-Day, has deferred it for eight Days, upon Account of the usual Funeral Ceremonies in this City, upon the Death of a King of Denmark. Prince George of Holftein, the youngest Brother to the appointed Successor in Sweden, and who has a Regiment of Dragoons in the Pruffian Service, is to be married to a Princels of Holftein-Beck, and Dowager Counters of Dohna. Heerderen Camp, Oct. 5, N. S. Prince Clermont's Aid de Camp, who was dispatched by him to Marshal Saxe on Sunday Morning, was taken by some of our Hussars with his Difpatches. We fince hear that the faid Prince was to be, with the Body of Troops under him that were employed in the Siege of Namur, on the 7th at Judoigne, and the 8th at St. Tron, in order to join the Marshal. Our Army passes the Jaar To-morrow or next Day. We have just heard that the Enemy abandoned Huy Yefterday Morning, to join that Corps likewife to their main Body. Our Huffars had a Skirmish on our Left with four Squadrons of the Enemy's, which they attacked in their Flank, routed them, and took 15 or 16 Prisoners, and as many Horles; but perceiving five or fix more Squadrons and fome Foot coming to their Relief, they retired with little or no Loss. The first Column of the Bayarians comes this Day to Aix.
