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He Dyet has been Affembled for feveral days, though as yet they have not come to any final refolution concerning the time to be prefixt for the Election of a new King, but all agree, that it ought to be hallened as much as pollible , in the mean time the Archbishop of Gnejn#, in the name of the Senare, and the Sieur Bielinski on the part of the Nobility, have been to Condole with the Queen for the death of the late King. The Grand Marefehal Sobietski continuing to excule his coming hither, to be prefent at the Election, the Dyer has written to prefs him to it, they thinking his prefence abfolutely necessary. Amongst the Candidates to the Crown, the Brother of the prefent King of Denmark, and the Son of the Duke of Newburgh fecht to make great pretences. A Copy of a Letter from the Grand Signior to the King of Poland, delivered by the Turkifb Chiaux, after the Kings death.

Admini@rator of the Nazarene Kingdom of Poland, King Michael our Friend, may your Admini@fration have a happy iffue; By these Letters we

give you to understand, that Achmet Baffa our Grand Vizier is the chief Administrator of our Dominions, the Dignity and Authority of whole Ministry let God encreale; We have not long fince anderstood, that you refule to pay to our Serene Majesty, the Tribute ftipulated by the late Treaty between us and you's and to remove the Garrifons out of your places on the Frontiers; wherefore it appears clearer then the Light that you have broke the Peace that was concluded with me, and is it thus lawful for you in fo Thort a time ro violate the Peace ? the Governors and Soldiers of ytolate the Péace ? the Governors and Soldiers of our Frontier places have not done you? Subjects any damage, nor given you any caule of offence, where-fore then have you broke the Peace ? and why have you provoked me the Monarch of the World 'to anger? What does your Sokdiers think to delude, us. Send us quickly the Tribute and the Girts, which by vertice of the Treaty, though by you violated, and the promile of your Envoye onghe to have been paid on the day of St. Demetrize laft haft. Send them on the day of St. Demetrius last past. Send them guickly, if you will that the antient Treaties between us be preferved and re-established ; Send the Gifts, restore the Castles, repair the damages, and do it fufficiently, unless you defire to be by my Arms compelled to it ; if you omit it, by the help of God, I will with innumerable Armies infeft and deftroy thy Poland. Be therefore ready for Wat, and fend back my Meffenget quickly, that I may know your mind
