By our last Advices from Broffels, Marshal Saxe continued there, and had given Orders to the French Officers not to part with their Equipages, but to whold themselves in Readiness' to march 'at a Moment's Warning. The French were fortifying Louvain, and a Garrison of 3000 Men was ordered to Nivelle.
