E hear from Cadiz, that se-veral Settees had been hired there by the Intendant, to carry to the Mediterranean 500 Men, that were to be draughted out of the Troops of that Garrison, though it only consisted of four Battalions, and they far from compleat; and that the fame Vessels were to call at Ceuta, in their Way, to take on board likewise another Draught from that Garrison. By Advices from Carthagena, all the Troops there are marched for Catalonia, and the Inhabitants mounted Guard, and did Duty in their room. M. Navarro, who was Commander in Chief of the Spanish Squadron at Carthagena, had been difgraced, and succeeded by M. d'Anteil, a Frenchman, who was the Rear-Admiral under him. Letters from Madrid mention, that it was reported that a Resolution had been taken by the Court to reinforce their Army in Italy, by ordering the Troops that were in the Principality of Catalonia, to march thither, and that some Battalions were to be drawn off from Majorca and other Places, for the same Purpose.
