tilly, or Extraparochial Place, to any Fair, j Market, Town, Parish, or other Extraparochial Place, for Sale; unless fuch Certificate or Certificates, as are before required to be delivered upon the Sale of such fatted Beast, Hide and Skin, he produced to him or them ; and, in case no such Certificate or Certificates be produced, then to carry the Offender or Offenders before some Justice or Justices of the Peace, to be dealt with according to Law. And whereas it has been found by Experience, that nothing can contribute so effectually to prevent the spreading of the faid Distemper, as by killing the Cattle when it first appears upon them, before it begins to be infectious, and communicates itself to the reft of the Herd, so it is of absolute Necessity that Infrectors should be appointed for that Service: His Majesty doth therefore hereby impower and require the Juffices of the Peace of the feveral Counties, Ridings, Divisions, Cities, Liberties, and Towns Corporate, to appoint one or more Inspector or Inspectors of the Houses, Buildings, Grounds, and Cattle in their respective Divisions, where any Infection now is, or hereafter shall appear to be, for the Purposes contained in his Majefty's Order of Council of the laid, Twelfth Day of March Laft, and of this Order; who are to take care that such infeded Cattle be killed as foon as the Diftemper thall appear upon them, and to do every other Thing according to the faid Orders, and fuch Autructions as they shall receive from the faid Juffices, from Time to Time, to answer the Ends thereof. And his Majesty doth hereby surther order, That no Person or Persons do buy, sell, or expole, or offer to Sale, or cause to be bought, fold, or exposed, or offered to Sale, the Milk, Carcale, Flesh, Fat, or Intrails, or any Part «fany infected Beaft; or feed, or caule to be fed, any Hog, Calf, Lamb, or any other Animal therewith. And whereas it is of absolute Necessity, that the Hides and Skins, as also the Horns, and exery-other Part of any infected Beaft that shall die of the faid Diftemper, should be buried with the Carcale, and that the Hides should be flathed and cut in the fame Manner as is required by his Majefty's aforementioned Order of Council of the Twelfth of March last, to be vobserved with respect to the Cattle that are directed to be shot, or otherwise killed. And whereas a due Compliance therewith may be attended with some Loss to the Proprietors of such Cattle; his Majesty, in Consideration thereof, doth hereby promife, That the faid Proprietors shall be paid for every Ox, Bull, or -Cow, that shall die of the faid Diffemper, and be, buried in the Manner required by the first Article in his Majesty's aforementioned Orden

of Council, any Sum not exceeding Ten Shillings, the Numbers, and Values, and Conformities to the above Rules, to be afcertained mi like Manner as is required by the aforementioned Order in Council, with respect to factor Cattle as shall be shot, or otherwsie killed, shall be shot, or otherwsie killed,

And whereas the Lords of his Majeffy's Privy Council did, by their Order on the Twenty fifth of November, One thousand seven handred and forty five, nominate and appoint certain Justices of the Peace, to take due Order and Care in relation to the infected Cattle in the County of Middlefex, by purfuing the fame Methods that were used in the Year One thoufand feven hundred and fifteen, which Juffices have appointed Infpectors or Surveyors, and have, from time to time, reported to the Lords of his Majefty's Privy Council, their Proceedings therein. And whereas it will create z great and unnecessary Expence, if the Juffices. of the Peace should appoint particular Inspec-1 tors for every Division in the faid County of Middlefex, his Majeffy doth therefore hereby require and command, That the Juffices named in the faid Order, do proceed in the Execution. of the same, and do likewise put in Execution his Majefty's Order of Council of the Twelfth Day of March laft, and this prefent Order, within the County of Middlefer. And his Majefly doth hereby ratify and confirm all the Rules, Orders, and Regulations, and also all and every other Part of his aforementioned Order in his Privy Council of the Twelfth of March laft, unless where the fame is varied by this present Order. And his Majefty doth hereby firicity charge and command all his Juffices of the Peace, Conflables, Churchwardens, and Overfeers, and all Farmers, Cowkeepers, and others, to conform themselves to what is thereby required, as zho by this his: further Order in his Privy Council. And his Majefty being informed, that feveral Cow-keepers and Farmers have thewn great Unwillingness to comply with his Majefty's faid Order in Council of the Twelfth of March last, from an Apprehension of the Difficulties and Delays that might attend their foliciting the Payment of the Rewards or Recompence promised by his Majesty's faid Order, his Majefty doth therefore hereby notify and declare, That the Rewards or Recompence promited thereby, shall, for the future, be paid, without Fee or Reward, or any Deduction whatforver, by John Shorpe Elquire, Solicitor of his Majefty's Treasury, at his Chambers, Nº 11: in Lincoln's Inn, or his Affifiant, in whole Hands Money shall be constantly deposited, to answer the Demands of all fuch Perforts who that bring or fend Certificates to him in the Manner and Form required, And
