Hamburgh, Febr. 8. From Stockholm they write, that their Majesties are, as yet, at Jacobsdal, two leagues from that City, but that the Twenty fifth of the Moneth past they intended to begin their journey towards the Univerfity of Hofil, which they had till then deferred, by reason of the bad weather . That the Count de Wringet, who had formerly ferved the Poles in their Wars against the Turks, was appointed by the King togo Ambaliador to War faw, to condole with the Ocean, upon the death of the late King, and to be prefent at the Election: That the Sieur Wangelin who arrived there with the Treaty of Defence, concluded with the Elector of Brandenburgh, was returned again with it ratified. That the French Minister, with great earnesinels presses that Crown to declare in favor or the King his Master, according to the Obligation, as he fays, of the late Treaty concluded between the two Crowns. Our Letters from Copenhagen, confirm the conclusion of the Treaty Defensive, between the Emperor and that Crown; and in the mean time of the Dutch Minister there is negotiating a nearer alliance between his Majesty, and the States General of the United Pro-

Cologne, Febr. 16. The fourteenth instant, about four in she afternoon, Prince Willem of Furffenberg, going according to his usual custom, in his Coach, attended by his Secretary, and two other Gentlemen, who were in the Coach with him, and three Footmen, to wait upon the Elector of Cologne, whose cheif Minister he is, and Plenipe tentiary at the Treaty of Peace, which is negoriated here being near to the Abbey of S. Pantaleen, here in Town, where his Electoral Highness has resided since the taking of Bon, was attacked by a party of nine men, armed all with Swords and Fire-arms, another party of like number keeping at some distance to affiff them, if there had been occasion, commanded by the Marquess d'Obizzi, Major of the Marquess de Gran's Regiment, which is at Ban. They having They having befet the Princes Coach, Iome pulled the Coachman out of the Box, and endeavored to secure the Footmen, while others affaulted the Gentlemen that were getting out of the Coach, who, though only armed with their Swords, behaved themselves very well in the defence of their Master, but being unable long to result fo unequal a force, the Prince was by the party carried away in his own Coach, his Secretary, and the two Gentlemen, being left for dead upon the place, and one of the Footmen dangeroully wounded. On the other fide, the Marques a'Obiqqi, who commanded in this action, was very much wounded, as likewife another of his party, and one killed. About two Muskers shot from the Gates of the Town, attended a Troop of Horse, and a Company of Foor, who having received the Prince under their Guard, Jent back the Coach, and estried him to Duyts, on the other fide of the River, right opposito to this place, and from thence, the next morning early, conveyed him to Bon; from whenge, is faid, they will farther carry him to Vienna: The Marquels de Grand, in the thear time, dilowns his knowing any thing of the matter, and to does the Misiflers that are here for the Emperor, the King of Shain, and the States General of the United Provinces. The Sirque d'Obig i having been taken up very dangerwounded, was carnied to a Convent near the place,

where this action hapned; of which, our Magistrates had no sooner notice, but they sent a Guard to secure the said Marquess, demanding of him by host order he had committed this action in a free and neural City; to which he replied, That what he had done was by command of the Emperor. The French Ambassadors complain highly of this proceeding, and have taken into their possession, all the Papers of the Prince, and our Magistrates have in the interim, sent to Bon, to pray the Marquess de Grana to set the said Prince at liberty.

Animers, febr. 17. All the discourse here is of the great appearance of a sudden Peace between His Majesty of Great Britain, and the States General, and people are extreamly pleased at it. Our Letters from Amsterdam tell us, that the Squadron sitted out by that Admiralty in this expedition will be composed of 34 or 36 Men of War; 20 of which, to be mounted from 80

to 50 and 40 Gunsapiece,

Brussels, Febr. 21. We look upon the Peace, as good as concluded, between the King of Great Britain, and the States General, and rejoyce extreamly at it. From Cambrol we have advice, That Don Francisco d'Agurro, Lieutenant General of the Cavalry, had made an incution into the French Territories to command Contributions, and was returned again, having well succeeded in his enterprise. Our Levies go on apace. The French, we hear, complain highly of what has hapned at Colegne to the Prince of Furstenbergh, and hardly omit threats, if satisfaction be not made.

Hagge, Febr. 16. We expect with great impatience, the return of the Trumpetter, who went hence the fixth instant for England: It is certainly said, That the Sieur Odyk, the Sieur Van Beuningen, and the Sieur Van Haren, will go Ambassadors Extraordinary to His Majessy of Great Britain; and the Sieur Van Beuerning will remain at Cologne. The equippage notwithstanding the great appearance there is of Peace with the Crown of England, advances a pace, and the Officers of the several Ships have received their necessary Orders. The States of Holland are parted till the several of March next.

Amsterdam, Febr. 16. Our Letters from England occasion here an universal joy, for that they give us great hopes of a speedy Peace; the Actions of the East India Company are hereupon raised to 4/20, and we doubt not, but so so sawe have certain advice of the conclusion of the Peace, that they will rise to 460. The Commissioners imployed to raise the monys on Families, have reported to the States, the great difficulties they meet with in that affair, who to supply their present occasions, have again ordered the Two hundredth penny to be forthwith raised. At Deventer has been some diforders amongs the Soldiers in Garison there, for want of pay; but the business is made up again.

Paris, Febr 21. The news we have from England gives us little content; in the mean time, the King makes great preparations for War, the Drums beat daily for Men; and besides, the King has commanded that every Parish within the Kingdom, shall provide four Men to ferve in his Arneies. We told you in our last, what Officers are appointed to command the three Armies this Spring, but omitted that the Duke of Orleans, the Kings Brother, if to be General of the Kings Army, under his Majesty.
