Nuremberg, Febr. 1. The States of France have been assembled here, the Sieur de Feuillan being here on the part of the Emperor, who propounded to the States, that for their own security, and that of the whole Empire, they should bring their Troops together; as soon as possible, which the States readily agreed to.

Venice, Febr. 4. The Emperor has given such orders for the hastening the new Leyges with all the diligence that may be, being resolved to be very early in the Field this next Spring. The Count de Sibefaygor, President of the Council of Vizier, is sent hence for Poland, in Quality of Extraordinary Ambassador. The Count de Sizemir, Governor of Czestochowa in Cracow, is made General of the Guards who are to serve in the Emperors Army on the Rhine. The Prince of Lorraine is still here, having received an acceptable present of the favorable dispositions there in his behalf. From Hungary we have received, That those Rebels who had retreated into the Territories of the Duke of Verona, having refused to accept of the pardon offered them by the Emperor, have had a design to surprise a place called S. George, but that the Imperialists having notice of their design, had expected their coming, and totally defeated them, in which, we hope, will further settle the Peace of that Country.

Paris, Febr. 5. We have not as yet received any news, but the Marquis de Verneuil, commanding the French Troops in Alsatia, hath quitted the Territories of the Bishop of Bâle; but that on the contrary, he continues still his Quarters at Habsburg, in the County of Gengen, and those who have sent Deputies to him, to desire him to return from thence, in which doing, it is said, That the said Captain hath refused to do, dilligently by force. From Bâle, they say, that the Protestant Cantons were to meet there on the 15th instant, to consult concerning the Provisions intended them by the Spanish Ambassador for the purpose of the League.
