Mountains had been called into the Cuy to contribute to its Defence. The above-mentioned Letters fay farther, that upon the News of this Event, the King of Sardinia had immediately fent his Militia into the Genoese Territory, there to live at Difcretion. The Letters from Paris of this Day mention the Surrender of the Fortsels of Savona to his Sardinian Majesty. M. de Puisieux, who has been for some Days at Amsterdam, returns from thence directly to Breda. We have Advice that the Island of St. Marguerite was actually taken by one of his Britannick Majesty's Ships, and a Detachment from the Army; and that the Combined Army had taken Poffeffion of Castelane, and Draguignan, at which last Place the Duke of Crussol would have maintained himfelf, but he was driven away with great Lois, amounting, as fome Letters mention, to above 2000 Men; and upon this M. de Belleisle was retiring towards Toulon. By Advices from Toulon of the 21st past, we hear that the Englith Men of War, which were cruizing in the Mediterranean, made themselves Masters of the Island of St. Marguerite, the Fortifications of which they have blown up, and made 140 Men ¹**Prifoners**: Rotterdam, Jan. 3, N.S. M. de Puisieux passed through this Town last Saturday in his Way from Utrecht to Breda. By private Letters from Brest we have an Account, that upon the z2d past, no more than seven Ships of War ¹of the late M. D'Anville's Squadron, and 36 Transports, were arrived in the Ports of France; that the French had 1700 Sick; and that they had buried 2800 Soldiers and Sailors in America.
