Naples, February 7, N. S.

E DICTS have been published to invite the Merchants, and other substantial People in this City, to undertake to supply the Cavalry with Forage, and the Foot with Bread, for a certain fix'd Price during the approaching Campaign. The King has confirmed the Prince of Centola for three Years longer in the Charge of Regent of the Criminal Court of this City and Kingdom. On the 3d Instant the Battalion of the Militia Regiment Calabria Citra began their March from this City to reinforce the Garrison of Capoa. On the 6th their Majesties set out from this City to Portici.

Rome February 11. On the 24th past a Courier from Genoa passed by this City with Dispatches for the Court of Naples. The same Day Cardinal Alexander Albani received an Express with Dispatches from the Court of Vienna. In the last Week the Duke of Guadagnolo, first Chamberlain of Honour to the Pope, and Keeper of the Pontifical Chapel, resigned his Posts in Favour of his Son, with the usual legal Formalities, into the Hands of the Governor of Rome, the Assessor of the Inquisition, and two Advocates of the Consistory of Cardinals. The same Day M. Lezze, the late Venetian Ambassador, set out from this City on his Return home. The late Cardinal Marini having in his Will nominated the Pope Executor and Feuditary Heir, the Pope has appointed M. Argiviglieri his Auditor, to have the Direction of that Business. The Pope has conferred the Presidency of Urbino upon M. Stoppani, in the room of Cardinal Marini, deceased. Cardinal Accoramboni is taken dangerously ill of a malignant Fever. On the 7th Instant at Night died suddenly, at his Lodging, the Marquis of Santa Croce, Grandee of Spain, and Colonel of the Spanish Troops, who lately arrived here on his Journey to Naples. This Day the Secretary of State received an Estafette, with Notice of the Arrival at Nettunno of 500 Spaniards from the Coast of Spain to Naples.

Hambourg, March 7. A Smack which was cruising off the Mouth of this River, and had

several Pilots on board, was lost in the late Storm, and the whole Crew perished. We hear of no other Accident.

His Majesty's Ships the Amazon and Grand Turk, on a Cruise in the Channel on the 1st Instant, saw a sail, and after a Chase of about seven Hours came up with and took her: She proved to be the Loup, a French Privateer of St. Malo, mounted with 18 Carriage Guns and about 110 Men, and was formerly his Majesty's Sloop the Wolf.
