Geneva, March 14.

THE Spanish Troops remain in Provence and Languedoc; and a Party of them, which had been quartered in Savoy, have Orders to march into Provence. The Infant Don Philip and the Duke of Modena are at Montpellier.

Copenhagen, March 18. An Ordonnance is just made publick, dated the 14th Instant, which repeals two former Ordonnances made the 16th of October, and the 26th of November, 1745. for prohibiting the Exportation of Coin. That Matter is now restored to the same Terms on which it stood the 16th of October 1745. and, by vertue of the said Ordonnance, the Circulating and Exchanging of Bank Bills is to remain henceforth upon the Foot of the Octroy and Ordonnance of the 8th of March 1737.

Vienna, March 18, N. S. Count Schu-lemberg had, according to his last Letters, received the Sardinian Artillery from Tortona, but not that from Alexandria.

Berlin, March 18. The King of Prussia arrived here on Wednesday last, and was immediately attended by all the Foreign Ministers, to whom his Majesty gave Audience; and Yesterday Morning return'd to Potzdam.

Hambourg, March 21, N. S. The Prussian Resident, received, the Day before Yesterday, an Estafette from Zerbst, with News, that the reigning Prince died there on the 16th Instant.

Rotterdam, March 28, N. S. We hear that M. de Clermont Gallerande, at the Head of Fifteen hundred Men from the Garrisons of Louvain and Antwerp, went last Saturday to reconnoitre the Outworks of Bergen-op-Zoom, and was for

some Time within Cannon-Shot of the Place. His Royal Highness the Duke passed through this Town Yesterday Morning, in his Way to the Hague.

Hague, March 28, N. S. His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland returned hither Yesterday Morning from Willemstadt, where his Royal Highness had been to see the Disembarkation of the Troops that were arrived from England and Scotland.

By Letters from Lieutenant General Sinclair from Crook Haven, dated the 28th past, there is an Account, that of the four Transports which were separated from the Fleet, the Mary Gally was put into Crook Haven, the Adventure into Baltimore, and the Industry into Bear Haven; and that it was thought the Royal William had been driven more to the Westward, and taken Shelter in some Port betwixt Crook Haven and Galway.
