## From Satutday March 28, to Tuelday March 31, 1747

Naples, March 7, N. S. N the Night of the 22d past, two Abbes, Subjects to the Pope, by Name one Emilio and the other Lecce, were, by Order of the Committee of Diffidents, arrested and conducted to Caftle Nuovo, upon Suspicion of being Emisfaries from the Court of Vienna. On the 26th anchored at this Port, two Transport Vessels, one with the remaining Part of the King's Troops made Priloners of War at Tortona, and the other with 170 Spanish Soldiers arrested and conducted to Mahone as Prisoners of War, by an English Frigate, and fince released. On the 6th anchored likewife two other Transports from Genoa, with about 250 Recruits for the Swifs Regiment Jauch, mostly Croatians, Pandours and Germans, Deferters out of the Austrian Army. The King has appointed a Committee of five Subjects to enquire and examine into the Administration of the Duke Barretta; as Agent Victualler of his Troops, during the Campaign in the Ecclefiaftical State and Lombardy, Rome, March 11. The King of Spain, in the prefent dangerous State of Health of Cardinal Acquaviva, has charged M. Clementi, Auditor di Rota for the Spanish Nation, with his Affairs at this Court. On the 25th past, the Pope, attended by M. Simonetti, the Governot of Rome, M. Mesmer, Treasurer in Ordinary, and many Prelates of his Bed-Chamber, received, with the usual publick Formalities, from Cardinal Valenti Gonzaga, Secretary of State, the Oath as High Treasurer of the See of Rome, and invested him with all the Authority belonging to that Poft, of which his Eminency took Poffeffion accordingly, and teceived Comliments thereupon from the College of Cardimals, many Prelates, and the Nobility. Then the Pope nominated M. Simonetti Vice-Treafurer. On the 5th Inflant a Courier from Genoa, by Way of Orbitello, paffed by this City or Maples. On the 6th, Madame Fogliani, fter having feen the Antiquities of this City, proceeded on her Journey to Naples. Prepaations are making at Palo and other Villages, i The Reception of the Pope on the Journey which he intends to take to Civita Vecchia. Florence, March 14. By the last Mail from Lombardy we are informed, that in Confequence

of Directions from the Court of Vienna, Difpositions are making at Placentia to divide the large Train of Artillery, Mortars, Ammunition and military Stores, taken in the last Campaign at that Place from the French, Spaniards, Neapolitans, and Genoese; one half of which is to be configned to the King of Sardinia. Recruits from Germany by the Tyrol daily join the Auftrian Troops in Lombardy; and many Battalions of veteran Troops from Parma, Placentia, and other Garrison Places, have marched to join Marshal Schulemberg at Novi, who is making the neceflary Preparations to begin his Operations against the City of Genoa; to which End frequent Councils of War are held by the Austrian and Sardinian Generals,
