This is to give Notice, that his Majesty hath been pleased, by an Act of Parliament, intituled, An Act for the King's most Gracious, General, and Free Pardon, passed the last Session of Parliament, to pardon all such Persons who had, since the 25th of December 1743, deserted from his Majesty's Land Service, and shall, on or before the 1st Day of November next, return to his Majesty's Service in the Regiment, Troop or Company to which they did belong at the respective Times of such Desertion.

B. *The said William Bibbie is about Twenty eight Years of Age, about five Foot seven or eight Inches high, of a brown and ruddy Complexion, much pitted with the Small Pox, and scarrified on his Head under his Wig. The said Thomas Bibbie is about Twenty five Years of Age, about five Foot eight Inches high, a thin Man, of a fair Complexion, a sharp Nose and wide Nostrils, full Eyes, and out-mouthed, large Cheek Bones, and thin-faced downwards, both Seafaring Men, and lately taken out of a Privateer at or near Bristol.*
