Ount Richecourt is gone to vifit the Roads between this Place and Road thither without paining ake a new Mountains. This is defigned to facilitate the Transportation of Goods and Merchandizes into Lombardy, and Germany in particular, and if the Plan can be ex-. ecuted, fuch Merchandizes will be brought by the River from Leghorn to Signa, a Place some Miles distant from Florence, and from thence cross the Country towards Bologna and Ferrara, without paffing through this City. In Confequence of this Scheme, and to render it more perfect, Barks have been appointed at Ponte de Lago Scuro, which are to depart at certain regulated Times for Trieste, where the Court of Vienna has established Polt Waggons to carry fuch Merchandizes to Vienna, by which Means a regular Method of Trading will be opened between that Part of Germany and this State. From the Camp at Demont, Sept. 9. The King of Sardinia is encamped here with the Piedmontese Troops. The Austrians under General Brown are at Ayfone and Vinadio, about five Miles more advanced. Prince Piccolomini has with him 14 Battalions at Sambuc, about fe-

ven Miles farther. The Chain is continued by Posts of Grenadiers in the different Villages as far as Argentieres, where General St. André commands 2500 Men, detached. from Prince Piccolomini, and the Territory of France.

Francfort, Sept. 18, N. S. The Elector Palatine will remove this Week from Duffeldorff to Manheim.

Liege, Sept. 19, N.S. Some Letters from Italy mention, that the French feemed to be making Difpofitions for retiring out of the County of Nice to the other Side of the Var, whither they had tranfported their Hofpitals and Magazines. Of the ten Battalions which were at Puget, there fcarce remain 2000 Men. Fifteen Spanish Battalions, which had repassed the Var, have received Orders to march and occupy the Eminences of Menton.

Head Quarters at Richel, Sept. 25, N.S. We have made a Detachment of twelve Auftrian Battalions, and two Regiments of Auftrian Cavalry, together with the whole

Heffian Corps here, confifting of five Battalions and feven Squadrons, all whichwill pass over the Maese at Ruremonde the Day after To-morrow, where Marschal Bathiani will join them. The Enemy continue at Bergen-op-Zoom, and have made a Detachment of thirty Battalions to Putten to invest Lillo, after the taking
