

*Hague, October 3, N. S.* The Council of War, that was appointed to examine into the Conduct of General La Roque, has drawn up his Sentence, and laid it before the Prince of Orange, but it is not to be made Publick, or even pronounced, till first his Highness gives his Consent to it. We do not hear that the French have yet made themselves Masters of Fort Frederick Hendrick, or that they have even begun their Attacks against Lillo, where a Reinforcement of 500 Men, with all Sorts of Ammunition, arrived safely a few Days ago. But we have yet no Accounts of the Arrival of Major General Thierry, who was likewise sent from hence last Saturday to take upon him the Command in Chief of that Place.

*Hague, October 6, N. S.* Another Reinforcement of 200 Men was order'd last Wednesday to Lillo, where Major General Thierry arrived the Day after the Death of the late Commander M. de Vassy, who was killed by a Cannon-shot. Marshal Bathiani is arrived at Oudenbosch, and his Reinforcement of 18 Battalions and 25 Squadrons, conducted by the Prince of Wolfenbüttele, was to join the Army there Yesterday or To-day. The Prince of Orange intends to set out on Sunday or Monday for Brèda, in order to have an Interview with the Marshal. Admiral Schryver is arrived in the Texel, and has Orders to refit his Ships, and return to Sea as soon as possible.
