And for the better notifying of this Order, it is his Majefty's Pleafure that the fame be forthwith printed and published, and be also inferted in the next London Gazette, and be likewise read, together with the said former Orders of Council, in all Parish Churches, Chapels and other Places set apart for Divine Worship, on such Sunday in every Calendar Month as the Minister of such Parish shall think proper, agreeable to what is required by an Act passed in the last Selfion of the last Parliament.
