Stockholm, Noviember 3, O.S.

IT is now certain that the Diet will break up about the Beginning of next Month.

Drefden, Nov 22. The King and Queen of Poland will return hither Tomorrow from Hubertsburg for the Winter Seafon. Count Beftucheff is getting ready his Equipages for his Embafly to Vienna.
Hague, Nov. 28, N. S. They write from Provence of the 17 th Inflant, that the Head Quarters of the French Army were removed to Nice; that the Infant Don Philip was to be on Monday the zoth at Marfeilles ; and that Marfhal de Belleifle was preparing to go fpeedily to Paris. M. de Mirepois, who is to command the Army in his Abfence, has fixed his Quarters at Luc; and M. du Chatel will command under his Orders at Nice. Ten Battalions are left in the Pofts of Ventimiglia to fuccour that Place in Cafe of Neceffity. There are fo many of the Army fick, that three Hofpitals are ordered for their Uie at Aix, Toulon and Orange.

Whitehall, December 1.
The King has been pleafed to conffitute and appoint the Right Hon, John Lerd Delawar, Lieutenant General of his Majefty's Forces, to be Governor of Tilbury Fort.

Whitehall, November 23, 1747.

And it baving been furtber refrefented to his Majjefly, that Benjamin Branfdetn, a Riding Officer of the Cuffoms, in the Port of Yarmoutb in the County of Norfolk, affiked by otber Perfons, baving, on Sunday the 8 th of this Infant November, apprebended Fames Holt, a notorious Smugler 3 feveral Parfons, armed with Fire. Arms, to the Number of Eigbicen or Twenty, affer fring maty Times into the Houfe, wherein they bad fecured bim, broke open the Doors thetreof, and rifcued the faid Prijoner ; His Majeff, for tbe better dyfovering and bringing to $\mathcal{F}$ fufice tbe Perfons concerned in the Crimes above mentioned, is pleafed to promifo bis mof gracious Pardon to any one of the faid Offenders, who fall difcover one or more of bis Accomplices tberein, (except William Denny Fox, of Benacre, concerned in refuing the faid fames Holt) fo as be or they may be apprebended and convicted thereof.
