Lisbon, January 3, N.S.

IS Britannick Majesty's Ships the Vigilant and Pembroke, two of Rear - Admiral Boscawen's Squadron, having repaired the Damages they received in a Storm, are to fail from hence To-morrow Morning, in order to rejoin the said Squadron. Count Rosenberg, Minister from Vienna to this Court, is preparing to return Home, and M. Stolte his Secretary is to remain here with the Character of Resident. 'His Portuguese Majesty's State of Health continues much the same. No Person is yet named to succeed the late Cardinal de Motta, as Prime Minister. Letters from Madrid mention, that a great Number of Officers were arrived there from the Army in Italy, which had begun to separate for Winter-Quarters, and that Dispositions were making to keep the Infante Don Philip well supplied with Men and Money, to enable him to open the Campaign early in the Spring; but that notwithstanding the whole Kingdom ardently wished for Peace.
