He Prince having given in to the feveral Affemblies of the Corres, a particular account of his many exigencies, they were confidering on the means of railing Money; in which the three Eflates feem not to concur in their opinions, the Clergy endeavoring to exempt themfelves from all Impositions.

Ditto, Feb. 30. The 23 inflant, the Commons fent a Meffage to the Nobility and Clergy, that they thought it neceffary, for the good of the Nation, to Pericion the Prince to take on him the Crown, defiring each Blate to joyn with them herein; to which the Nobility prefently agreed, but the Clergy after a ferious confideration, and confulting the Prince, returned them this answer, That they thanked them for comnumicating to them their resolution of Crowning the Prince, but could not joyn with them in it.

Genoua, March 2. The French are making great preparations at Theulon, to fit out their Men of War and Galleys, and we are affured, they will have a very confiderable Fleet at Sea this Summer; Amongft others, this State feems much concerned at it, for as thin, s fland between the Crown of France and this Republick, we may well fear, his most Christian Majefly will at laft take the fatisfaction we have hitherto refuted to give him, for having fired on his Galleys the laft Summer. In the intrim we are not wanting to provide what we may for our own fecurity, and therefore all our Fortreffes, as well on the Terra Firma, as in the Isles of Corfica, are reinforcing, and will be fupplied with Ammuinition and all things necessary.

Inition and all things necessary. Venice, March 3. Our freiheft Letters from Conftansinepleare dated the fourth of January last, the chief contents whereof are; That the Grand Signior never had fo powerful an Army in the Field as he will have this Summer, in order whereunto, the Grand Signior had put up his great Standard, and had fent Orders to the Baffas of Damafcus, Cairo, and Soria, as well as wother places, by whick the first is obliged to provide 10000 Men, the fecond 4000 Janifaries, and the others a like number; the fame Letters add, that the Plague continges very violent at Conflaminopie. On Thurfday last the Duke and Dutchefs of New rs parted hence for Rome;

Balle, March 10. The Deputies of the 13 Cantons have for feweral days been Affembled here; the Mini-Rers of France, Spain, and Holland being on the place; and on Wednefday laft they concluded their Seffion, without that we yet particularly know, what they have done. We have advice that part of the French Troops which in the Command of the Marquis de Faubrua policies themfelves of Germer/Jein, are again marched towards the Noper Alfasia. The French fortify Brifac; and the City of Strasburg Wisnot unmindful to put it felf into a politure of defence. The 25 of the next month the Cantons will Affemble here again, when they will

finish several matters r elating to the present Conjuncture, which at their now parting, they left impertect.

Ratisbanne, March 12. The day being appointed for the Generals of the Empire to take the Oaths of Fidelity; they accordingly rendred themfelves at the Palace of the Bilhop of Aichftadt, the Imperial Commiffioner at the Dyet, where the faid Bilhop, the Deputies of the three Colleges, and the faid Generals being met, the Bilhop made to them a long Speech, which lafted an hour, in which, with great eloquence he endeavoured to fhew the neceffity the whole Empire at prefent lay under, to take up Arms for the fecurity of their Liberties and Eflages, &c. After which, the Generals Inftructions were read, and they folemally fivore, that they would follow and execute the fame according to their power; and fo the Affembly broke, up. The Marquis of Brandenburgh Culmbach is gone hence for Nurembergh, to be prefent there at the Affembly of the States of Franconia, and to haften the Troops of that Circle; it being refolved, that if poffible, the general Rendezvous shall be before the end of April.

Madrid, March 14. Last week died here the Duke de Terrs Nova, leaving his Son the Marquefs de Valle his Heir. The Queen hath intimated to the Marquefs de Liche, that unlefs he difpole himfelf to depart on his Ambassy to Rome within twelve days, the would confer that Honor on another. From Galia we heat; That the Dutch Men of War and Privateers that were cruising off that place, had fent in a French Prize from Barbary, laden with Hides, Almonds, and Dates, to the value of 5000 Pieces of Eight. That a Briss Ship from Kingfile had elcaped them and come in there is and having made a good Market, was gone there with another English Ship for Legern. That Evertifon being made Vice-Admiral of Zeand, would go there by Land, his Ship being not in a condition to fail having butforty men left, the reft killed in the Engagement with Captain Harman.

with Captain Harman. Hague, March 26. The States have refolved that the difference flill depending between Halland and Zeyland, about the Court of Juffice, fhould be referred to the Prince of Orange, as the Governor of both Provinces, unlefs it can be accommodated after the States of Zeyland have had an account of it from their Depuries, who are therefore goae to confult them about it. They have not yet agreed about the Prefer they are to make the Prince, and the payment of his Debts; but at their next meeting, would go on it again. The Billiop of Munfter's Minifler as yet appears not here. Monlieur Bening, who carried the Palsport, being ordered not to deliver it, unlefs he would admit of an Imperial Garrifon, or one from Us, anto Coesfeld and other places, which he feems not at all inclined to. The French we fay, are preparing to quit moth of the Places on this flde, they have already transported much of their Ammunition and Baggage from Zutphen and Tiel to Nimmegens and Fort St. Andre, fo that they may be demolifhed in half an hours all the Mines being ready.
