Hague, April 6. We now find that the report of the French being about to put Wefel into the hands of the Elector of Brandenburgh, is without any ground. The Prince of Orange haltens the preparations all he can, and we hope he will be in the Field, even before the Frenchor The Minister which refides on the part of this Stare at Storkholme, has lately written, That he has fome reason cochope he shall succeed in his Negociation there; that the Regents had labely fent to the Count of Starenberg, the Imperial Minister to acquaint hims Hat the King had fent orders to his Minifers to use their winoft endeavors with the most Cheiflian King, to Induce his Majely to admit of the Deputies of the Duke of Lorraine, ias Principals at the Congress at Gelogar, From whence we have advice, That the Treacy offaceommodation between the Emperor and the Elector of Cologne, feems wholly at a flaming for that the Exector will include therein the Prince of Eusstenste, and his Brother the Biftep of Streeburgh, which the Rapertal Manifers will not admit of. Our advices concerning the Frenches delivering up Wefel to the Elector of Brantenburgh have of Jare been very different; for one while it was faid, That they were about quitting the place, and pre-fently after it was again contradicted. The ninth inflant Prince Murice of Naffan received Letters, which gave him an account, that the fourth instant the French Garilon drew out from thence, and that at the fame time Colonel sibourg had taken possession thereof in the name of the Elector of Brandenburgh: It is likewife reported, That the French will do the like with Rees, and that they will fuddenly quit all the other places in those parts, Miestricht-excepted. It is very cerrain, that they are removing their Ammunition, Victuals. 8tc. from Aernheim to Nimmegen, which makes us believe, that they will in few days likewife abandon that place. Yefferday in the evening arrived here the Marquels d'Affentur from Bruffels, being fent by the Count de Monterey to concert with the Prince of Orange, the deficits of the Campagne, the Succors which on occasion are to be fent to each other, and the Rendezvous of the feveral Armies, it being refolved, That they shall act separately. We have advice, That Monfieur Rabenhaupt having defeated 1000 Munfter Horfe, was afterwards marched to Nieuwenbuyfen, and that on Saturday laft he had taken it by ftorm.
