AST Saturday the King of Denmark visited the Holm, and saw his Fleet and Naval Stores; and this Day the Regiment of Foot Guards, together with that of the Plince Royal, have performed their usual Exercise, and paffed in Review before his Majesty at Amalienbourg. Copenhagen, April 27, N.S. That on those Conditions the Admiral Confenter that the Garrison march out with their Arm's Colours flying, and Drums beating; (but no Cannon or Mortars, or any Ammunition whatfoever.)

Articles of Capitulation were figned on the 7th Instant, N.S. by Marshal Saxe and General d'Aylva, Governour of Maestricht, for the giving up of the Town upon honourable Conditions: In Confequence of which, the Garrison was to march out of the Town on the 10th Inftant, N. S. with Military Honours. And the 11th Inftant, N. S. was the Day named for the Ceffation of Hostilities in the Low Countries.
