THE King of Prussia still remains here reviewing his Troops, and it is said will return to Potzdam on Monday or Tuesday next.

Hague, June 7, N. S. The States General have given Directions to the Council of State, and to the five Colleges of Admiralty, and to the East India Company, to publish forthwith the proper Orders for a Suspension of Arms by Sea, in their respective Districts. In Consequence of the Resolution which was taken some Months ago, to incorporate several of the Corps that are Prisoners of War in France, a Regulation has been made, according to which the Officers and private Men of those Corps, who are Prisoners, are to enjoy their full Pay only to the 17th of this Month, after which the Officers are only to have a Pension, and the private Men to be reduced to half Pay, till they have their Liberty. General Constrom has, in Obedience to an Order he lately received from the Prince of Orange, given up the Command of Bois le Duc to Lieutenant General Constant, and is now retired to his Country Seat. M. Iddikinga, who was lately Deputy from Groningen to the States General, has quitted that College; and taken his Seat in the Council of State; and, as M. Verelt has been obliged, on Account of his ill State of Health, to resign his Commission of Deputy to the Dutch Army, the Council of State has appointed M. Iddikinga to succeed him. M. de Freyra, the King of Portugal's Minister to the States General, arrived here this Morning.
