Hague, June 7, N. S. The Prince of Orange's intended Journey to Bredathas been postponed, on Account of theerepeated Advices his Highness has received of the great Disturbatil ces in the Provinces of Priesland; and it is how? thought he will repair to Leeuwarden before he goes-to the Army. The Violences committed by the Peasants in that Province has been very great. All the Houses belonging to the Farmers of the Revenue have been plundered, and laid level with the Ground; and several other Houses belonging to Gentlemen who were thought to be averse to any Alteration in the Government, have been teduced to Ashes.
