**T**HES E are to give Notice to all Owners or Masters of Ships, being his Majesty's Subjects, that they may be furnished with proper Passes, upon Application to the Office of one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

This Day being the Anniversary of his Majesty's Succession to the Crown, the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at Noon, and all other publick Rejoycings were shewn on this Occasion.

Last Thursday Morning his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, set out for Harwich, where his Grace embarked between Four and Five o'Clock that Afternoon for Holland, in his Way to Hanover.

Bern, June 8, N. S. The Annual Diet of the 13 Cantons usually assembled at Frauenfeld is fixed for the 1st of July.

Dresden, June 12. The King and Queen of Poland arrived in good Health at Warsaw on the 1st Instant. Last Monday Morning the Electoral Princess, who had been indisposed for some Days, miscarried. She was about three Months gone with Child.

Hague, June 14, N. S. The Success which the Peasants had in the Province of Friesland, in obtaining of the States the Abolition of several Taxes, has encouraged the Inhabitants of some of the other Provinces to expect the same of their Superiors, and there have been some Disorders at Rotterdam and other Towns of Holland. In order to prevent the bad Consequences of these Commotions, the Prince of Orange and the Deputies of the Council have issued a Proclamation, in which they set forth the many Inconveniences that would infallibly attend the Abolition of the Taxes demanded, and represent the Impossibility the States are in, of supporting the Expences that are incumbent on them, without those Taxes, or others which would fall heavier on the Inhabitants of the Province. For which Reason, they exhort every one not to oppose or resist the Pachtors or their Substitutes in the Collection of the Revenues which they farm, but to remain quiet till the Government can conveniently examine into the Grievances of which they complain; declaring, at the same Time, that the Refractory shall be severely punished as Disturbers of the publick Peace.

Rotterdam, June 18. The Mob committed some Disorders Yesterday at Leyden, and last Night pull'd down some Houses, but no great Mischief was done. The People of Amsterdam were threatned with a Tumult last Night, but the Mob give out that next Thursday is the Day which they have fix'd on to assemble;

however, as the Magistrates have Notice thereof, it is hoped that any ill Consequences will be prevented.

Hague, June 18, N. S. The Prince of Orange is considerably recovered, but so weakened by his Fever, that it will be some Time before his Highness can be in a Condition to take his Journey to Leewarden.

Hanover, June 12, N. S. The King arrived at Herrhausen on Tuesday the 4th Instant, in perfect Health, God be praised.

Hanover, June 16, N. S. On Thursday last M. Klingraffe, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Prussia, had his first Audience of his Majesty, in which he presented his Credential Letter.

Head Quarters at Nistleroy, June 18. Yesterday Marshal Bathiani, and most of the Imperial Generals, were at his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland's Quarters to take their Leave, as they were to march this Day towards Ruremond.
