The Inveteracy of the Populace against the Pachters begins likewife to appear in the "Province of Utrecht, notwithstanding the Refolution that was lately taken there to supprese the Imposts supon the several Necessaries of Life. At Amersford the Magistrates have been obliged to abolish all the Taxes, to prevent the Mischief that was threatened.
