Constantinople, May 25.

**T**HE Tartar Han died a few Days past, and Aslan Ghirai, one of the Family, and late Kalga to Fethi Ghirai, who was at Viset, a Town beyond Adrianople, succeeds him. The Grand Signior's Master of the Horse is set out to carry him the Sword, and the other Marks of Honour conferred on that Nomination. By a Tartar arrived Yesterday from Babylon, we have Advice of Kesterley Pascha's being received there as Pascha, according to the Grand Signior's Intention, and of Solyman Cheaia's having accepted another Government, so that Matters seem quieted in that Province. The Neapolitan Minister is recalled, and has taken his Leave of the Foreign Ministers.

Leghorn, June 17, N. S. By Letters of the 12th Instant from Savona, there is Advice, that his Sardinian Majesty had given Directions to prepare for evacuating that Town and Castle, having embarked a large Quantity of military Stores for Cagliari, and a great Number of Oxen and Mules are daily employ'd to carry the Remainder to Turin.

Lisbon, June 17, N. S. By Advices from Oporto, his Britannick Majesty's Sloop Scorpion arrived there on the 20th past with the Merchant Ships from England.

Hague, July 9, N. S. The Prince of Orange was last Saturday at the Assembly of the States of Holland, and laid before them the three great Points of Redress which the People expected from the Change in this Government. The Deputies of Zealand have published a Proclamation, setting forth, That as they have heard that Numbers of their Inhabitants had expressed a great Desire of having the Imposts abolished, as had been done in Holland, they thought proper to give Notice, that neither they, nor the Regency of the several Towns, being authorized to abolish so considerable a Branch of the publick Revenue, they had taken the only Method they can make use of to satisfy their People, which is, to desire the Stadtholder, and the States of the Province, to appoint Deputies to consult on the Abolition of those Imposts, in the Manner that may tend most to the Satisfaction of their Inhabitants, and the Advantage of the State; exhorting all their People to wait quietly for the Result of those Deliberations. The Magistrates of Amsterdam have offered a Reward of Five hundred Florins for the apprehending of any of the Ringleaders in the last Riot; they have also promised to give the like Sum to the first Company of Burghers that shall be assembled under Arms, in case of any future Alarm. The Chevalier d'Osorio did not leave this Place till this Morning, but Count

Czernichew proceeded on his Journey to Hanover last Saturday. M. Boufinelli, who is going to reside at the Court of Great-Britain on the Part of the Republick of Venice, arrived here last Night in his Way to England.

Head Quarters at Nistleroy, July 9, N. S. We have begun this Week to enter into Cantonment, and, it is said, that by the Middle of the next all his Majesty's British and Electoral Troops will be under Cover.

This Morning arrived from Hanover his Majesty's Ratifications of his Acceptance of the Accession of the Court of Spain, and the Republick of Genoa, to the Preliminary Articles signed at Aix la Chapelle, the 28th of June; N. S. 1748.
