HER Imperial Majesty is expected to go to Moscow this Winter with her whole Court, notwithstanding that the Quarter of that Town, where her Imperial Majesty used to reside, is entirely burnt, except her own Palace.

Berlin, Aug. 17, N. S. The King of Prussia is returned to Potzdam, and, it is said, is to make a Tour into Silesia at the latter End of the Month. M. Valori, the French Minister, is now at Potzdam on his Return to France.

Aix, Aug. 21, N. S. M. St. Severin is expected here this Evening from Compeigne.

Hague, Aug. 23, N. S. The Magistrates of Amsterdam have issued a Declaration, in which they say, that though they might have looked upon the Petition which was lately presented to them by a Deputation from the Burghers, as a Thing that deserved no Manner of Regard, since it was signed by no Body, and the Original of it was never shewn to them; yet they were willing, for this once only, to believe what the Deputies asserted; and to tell them, in Answer to the first Article, that they had already, by their Deputies, adjusted with the Prince of Orange the Affair of the Post Offices, as far as depends on them, and hoped to terminate it soon to his Highness's Satisfaction. As to the second Point, relating to the Disposal of Employments, they had long since consented to the Resolutions of the States of Holland on that Head, and would, together with the other Towns, send in the Lists of the Employments in their Gift, at the Time appointed for that Purpose. In respect to the third Article they say, that they have always, to their utmost, maintain'd their City and Burghers in the Possession of all their Rights and Privileges: That they have nothing to do with the Election of the Officers of the Militia, which depends on the Council of War; and that the Demand of the Burghers, relating to the Exclusion of their Officers from the Magistracy, is unprecedented, and directly contrary to the constant Practice of all Times since Prince William the First put their City in Possession of its present Rights and Privileges. A Deputation from the States of Friesland is arrived here with the Diploma of the hereditary Succession to the Stadtholdership, in the Prince of Orange's Male and Female Issue. Count Flodorp, one of the Prince of Orange's Aid de Camps, was dispatch'd Yesterday to Brussels, with a Commission from his Highness to Marshal Saxe.
