**Y**ESTERDAY General Lieven, who, upon Prince Repnin's Death, had taken the Command of the Russian Army in the Pay of the Maritime Powers, passed thro' this Place in his Way from the first Column thereof to that of the Centre: And Orders having been received for the Troops, which composed it, to return to their own Country, the Russian Generals had come to an Agreement with the Commissaries for carrying back their Sick to Bohemia.

*Hambourg, Aug. 21, N. S.* According to the latest Letters received here from Stockholm, the King of Sweden finds such Benefit from the Course he is in of the Spaw Waters, which have enabled him to make an Excursion to Carlsberg, that Hopes are conceived, that his Majesty may yet recover from his late dangerous Indisposition.

*Head Quarters at Eyndhoven, Aug. 27, N. S.* On the 24th in the Evening his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland arrived here from Hanover, and proposes to set out for England on Sunday or Monday next.

*Hague, Aug. 27, N. S.* The Burghers of Amsterdam do not seem to be at all satisfied with the Answer the Regency thought proper to return last Week to their Petition; and every Thing is once more in such a Situation in that Town, as gives Room to fear, that still greater Disorders are likely to ensue than have yet been seen there. The Prince of Orange's Deputation to Friesland is to set out To-morrow or next Day for that Province: M. Gavaerts is appointed one of the Deputies instead of M. C. Bentinck, who is to depart for Hanover some Time this Week. The solemn Deputation from the States of Friesland delivered, a few Days ago, to the Prince of Orange, the Diploma of the Hereditary Succession in the Male and Female Line of his Highness's Issue. And Yesterday the Prince received an Express from Groningen, with Advice, that the States of that Province have taken the Resolution to give him the Disposal of all their Great Civil Employments; a Power they had hitherto reserved to themselves. The Inhabitants of the Country of Drenthe, animated by the Example of their Neighbours of Groningen and Friesland, have begun to commit several Disorders, and we hear that every Thing there is in the utmost Confusion.

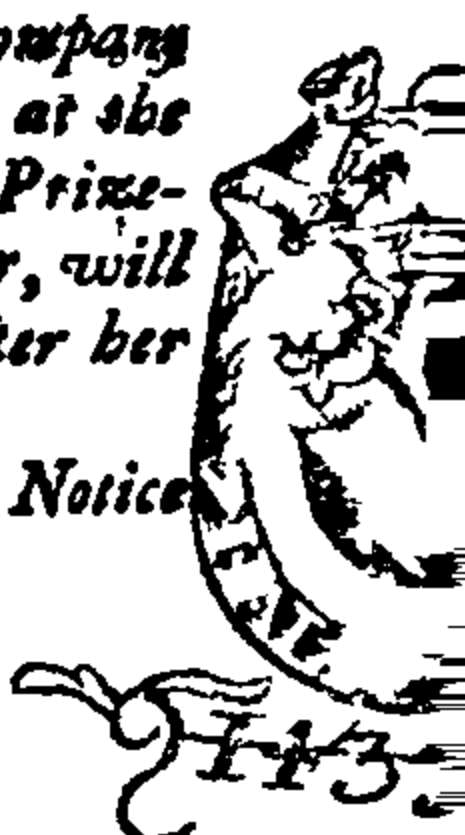
