## Liege, October 4; N.S.

HE French have withdrawn two Regiments of Huffars, and one of Infantry, out of the Dutchy of Limbourg. The Regiment of Lowendahl hath quitted Maestricht; and they are making Preparations for removing the Bombs, Bullets, Ammunition, and fome Artillery. The Boats that are intended to load them paffed Yefterday and this Day through this Place; and the French Commiffary hath fixed the 15th Instant for felling the Wood and Faggots at Maestricht. The Bridge of Boats, which was over-against Fort St. Peter's, is withdrawn, and they are now working hard to get every Thing ready for moving the heavy Train and Mortars. They write from Louvain, that Part of the Garrison was marched towards the Frontiers of France, and the Remainder had received Orders to be ready to follow them. Marshal Saxe is to set out Tomorrow for Paris. , Hague, Oct. 4, N.S. Several feditious Papers having been printed and difperfed about the Streets at Amfterdam, fince the Prince of Orange's Return from thence, with a View to foment the Discontent of the Burghers, and to excite them to form new Pretensions; the Regency of that City have iffued a Proclamation, by which they promise to pay a Reward of 5000 Florins, to whofoever will discover the Author of the faid Libels, and 2000 Florins for the Discovery of the Printers thereof. The States of Holland have refolv'd upon a Lottery, upon the fame Plan as the two former, except that the Number of Tickets is to be left undetermined. The States of Zealand have farm'd out, as usual, the Revenues of their Province; but as the People of feveral Towns had refolv'd to oppose this Measure, the States, who were determined to maintain this ancient Custom, till such Time as fome Method can be found for replacing those Funds, thought proper to support their Authority, by commanding Military Force the Day that the Contract was renewed with the Pachters. Hague, Oct. 8, N. S. M. Haffelaer, whofe Presence was thought necessary at Amsterdam to prevent any Difturbances, still continues there; and a Committee has been appointed in that City, for the Collection of the Funds to be tailed by the Method lately introduced, for supplying the Deficiency occasioned by the Aboli-'tion of the Farms. Meff. de Catwych and Pauw changed Yesterday the Regency of Haerlem, in Confequence of the Commission given them for that Purpole by the Prince of Orange. Some Removals are likewife to be made in the Regencies of Leyden, Tergau, and Gorcum; but it is thought, that in most of the other Towns, the present Magistrates will be conti-

nued. The Prince of Orange's Commiffarics are returned from Friefland, having adjusted the Differences there, to the general Satisfaction of both Parties. General Burmania, who came hither a few Days ago, to settle some Affairs with the Prince Stadtholder, relating to the Winter Quarters for the Dutch Troops, intends to return to the Army in a Day or two; as does likewise Field Marshal de Nassau, who is perfectly recovered from his late Illnefs. Count Gronsfeld, the States General's Minister at the Court of Berlin, arrived here last Sunday Evening. And Count Wartenfleben returned at the same Time from Germany, whither he was sent fome Time ago, with a Commission to negociate Troops at feveral Courts, for the Service of their High Mightineffes.
