ER Majesty the Queen of Denmark seems to be in persect Health, and advances happily in her Pregnancy. Hague, Nov. 22, N.S. The Escorts have been demanded of the Prince Stadtholder to attend his Majesty to Helvoetsluys, and they have accordingly been order'd to be in Readiness at Utrecht by Wednesday the 27th Instant, N. S. to wait his Majesty's Arrival. His Grace the Duke of Newcastle is expected here either Sunday or Monday next. Although the Fiscal and two Councellors of the Court of Justice have been at Leyden some Days, in order to take Informations, no Body has yet been apprehended there; and it is even said, that the chief Perfons concerned in the late Disturbances have all made their Escape.
