Phillip Goodall, on the 25th of January 1748, about Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon, between Halldown and Chudleigh in the County of Devon, in the Hundred of Exminster, was robbed of Thirty-five Guineas in Gold, Seven Shillings in Silver, and an Horse Whip, by a Person to him unknown, who with Black Crape before his Face, assaulted him, and demanded his Money in these Words, saying, Money he wanted, and Money he must have; and presented a Pistol to him, and made him turn out his Pockets, and then demanded his Watch, Mr. Goodall telling him he had none. The Robber was mounted on a Black Horse with a White Star in his Forehead about Fifteen Hands high.
