HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Hon. ,Mr. Bellenden, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that, The Lords, authorized by Virtue of his Majesty's Commission, for declaring his Royal Assent to se-Veral Bills agreed upon by both Houses, desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission gread; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Chancellor, and Jeveral other Lords, to pass the Royal Assent to feveral publick and private Bills, was read ac-Gordingly, and the Royal Affent given to,

An Act to charge the Sinking Fund with the Payment of Annuities, in Discharge of Navy, Victualling, and Transport Bills and Ordnance Debentures, to the Amount therein mentioned.

An Att to explain and amend so much of an Att made in the Ninth Year of the Reign of Queen Anne, intituled, An Att sor establishing a General Post Office for all her Majesty's Dominions, and for settling a Weekly Sum out of the Revenues thereof for the Service of the War, and other her Majesty's Occasions, as relates to Horses or Furniture to be lett to Persons riding Post.

An Act for the more effectual preventing the Importation and Wear of Foneign Embroidery and Brocade, and of Gold and Silver Thread Lace, or other Work made of Gold or Silver Wire manu-

factured in Foreign Parts.

An Ast for the more effectual preventing of Frauds and Abuses committed by Persons employed in the Manufacture of Hats, and in the Woollen, Linen, Fustian, Gotton, Iron, Leather, Furt, Hemp, Flax, Mahair, and Silk Manufactures, and for preventing unlawful Combinations of

Journeymen Dyers and Journeymen Hot-Pressers, and of all Persons employed in the said several Manusactures, and for the better Payment of their Wages.

An Att for remedying Inconveniencies which may happen by Proseedings in Attions on the Sta-

tutes of Hue and Gry.

An Act for amending, explaining, and reducing into one Act of Parliament, the Laws relating to the Government of his Majesty's Ships, Vessels, and Forces by Sea.

An Act for encouraging the People known by the Name of Unitas Fratrum, or United Brethren, 40

settle in his Majesty's Golonies in America.

An Act for making an authentick Roll of Valua-

tion for the Shire of Argyll.

An Act for explaining and amending an Act passed in the Seventeenth Year of his present Maje-sty's Reign, intituled, An Act for raising and establishing a Fund for a Provision for the Widows and Children of the Ministers of the Church of Scotland, and of the Heads, Principals, and Masters of the Universities of St. Andrews, Glasgow, and Edinburgh.
