Provided, and be it further enacted, That if any Action or Suit shall be commenced against any Person or Persons for any Thing done in pursuance of this or any of the said former Acts, in every such Case the Action or Suit shall be brought within Six Calendar Months next after the Fact committed, and not afterwards, and in the County where the Fact hath been, or shall be committed, and not elsewhere; and the Defendant and Defendants in such Action and Suit, to be brought shall and may plead the general Issue, and give the special Matter of his Defence in Evidence at any Trial to be had thereupon, and that the fame was done in pursuance of the said former Acts, or this present Act; and if the same shall appear so to be done, or such Action or Suit to be brought after the Time limitted for bringing the same, or shall be brought in any other County, Pl ce or Places than where the Fact was committed, then the Jury shall find for the Defendant or Defendants, and upon such Verdict, or if the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs shall become Nonsuit, or discontinue his or their Action, after the Defendant or Delei dants shall have appeared; or if, upon Demurrer, Judgement shall be given against the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, the Defendant and Defendants, in every such Case, shall and may recover Treble Costs, and have such Kemedy for the same, as any Defendant or Defendants hath or have in any Cases by Law.
