Naples, June 24, N. S.

N the 18th, the Prince of Ardore, Ambaffador from this Court to that of France, arrived here from Paris, but will foon repair thither again with the fame Character. On the 19th failed from this Port for Sicily, on board of thirteen Tranfport Veffels, the Bourbon Regiment of Dragoons, ecorted by three of the King's Gallies, to cruize against the Barbary Pirates. On the 23d anchored at Taranto, a Veffel belonging to Fiume, loaden with Planks, Iron, and Tobacco; the Director of the Custom House, on a Pretence that he had contraband Goods on board, caused the Cargo to be feized and unloaded; the Master, seeing himself deprived of his Goods, and meeting afterwards at Sea a Neapolitan Tartan laden with Corn, boarded her, and took out 1100 Tumolis of it, giving a Receipt to the Master on the faid Director for the Payment thereof. Rome, June 28, N.S. On the 16th anchored at Civita Vecchia, by Distress of Weather, a Swedish Ship from Smirna for Leghorne, with many Turkish Merchants on board, who are going to fettle in that Place, in Confequence of the Treaty of Commerce lately stipulated between the Emperor as Great Duke of Tufcany, and the Porte. The Magistrates of Health, at the prefling Instances of those of Venice and Naples, have subjected all Veffels from Tuscany to 14 Days Quarantine. On the 26th the Pope, attended by his Retinue and Guards, returned to Rome from Castle Candolfo. Hague, July 22, N.S. M. Stein was on Friday last elected Pensionary of Holland. The fame Day the States of Holland came to a Refolution, to authorize the Committee appointed to examine into the Affair of the Post Offices, to take the Direction and Management of those Offices out of the Hands of the present Pcsselfors, and to settle the Manner in which it will be proper to indemnify the faid Polleflors for the Loss they will sustain on this Occasion. Field Marshal Count Maurice of Nassau, was appointed last Saturday, by the States General, Governor General of Dutch Flanders.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made, in the Fifteenth Year of his prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act for Vacating the Office of King's Professor of Physick in Dublin, upon the Death or Surrender of the present King's Professor, and for Erecting three Professors of Physick in the faid City instead thereof, it is, among other Things, Enacted, That upon the next Vacancy in the faid Professorship, by the Death or Surrender of Doctor James Grattan, the Body Politick and Incorporate of the King's Professor of Phyfick in the City of Dublin, created by the Charter therein mentioned, should be diffolved, cease and be void; And that there should be thenceforth for ever, within the faid City, three Profeffors, to be called by the Names of the King's Professor of Physick in the City of Dublin, the King's Professor of Chirurgery and Midwifery in the City of Dublin, and the King's Professor of Pharmacy and the Materia Medica in the City of Dublin; and that the Provoft of Trinity College near Dublin, the Professor of Physick in the fame, the Prefident and two eldest Cenfors of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, all for the 1 ime being, should be Examinators of the Candidates who should offer themselves for the faid three Professorships. AND WHEREAS the faid Doctor James Grattan is fince dead ; NOW we the Examinators aforefaid, having this Day met at the faid Provost's House in Trinity College aforefaid, do hereby, in Pursuance of the faid Act, give this publick Notice, That the Examinations, in the feveral Parts of Phyfick, of the Candidates who shall offer themselves for the said three Profession flors, will be held at Trinity College near the City of Dublin, on Monday, Tuesday and Wedneiday, which will be the Twenty-fifth, Twenty-fixth and Twenty-seventh Days of September next; the faid Examinations to begin at One of the Clock in the Afternoon of each of faid Days, and to continue for Two Hours each Day. And in order to encourage Candidates to offer themselves for such Professorships, NOTICE is also hereby given, That the faid Professions will be intitled to the Use of the Library in the faid Act mentioned, and to the clear Rents and Profits of the real Effate of the late Sir Patrick Dun, Knight, M. D. deceased, and to the Produce of the Residue of his personal Estate, to be laid out as the faid Act directs; all to be equally divided among fuch three Professors (and now computed, at a gross Calculation, to be about Ninety Pounds a Year or upwards to every one of the faid Professors respectively, and, at the Fall of a Life, will be confiderably more) during fuch Time as they thall
