The Great Council has been affembled this Day from Seven in the Morning till Three in the Afternoon; which Time was taken up in reading Depositions and Confeffions of the feveral Priloners fill confined on Account of the late Confpiracy; and it is expetted that on Monday or Tuesday next Sentence will be paffed.

Orders were immediately given to put the Coaff. of the Two Suches in the beff Poffure of Defence. The Pope's Nuncio made thereupon a Reprefentation to the King, which his Majeffy remitted to the Magithrates of Health to be examined, but Orders were renewed to observe the Determination already taken. The Difagreements between this Court and that of Rome, on Account of fome Deferters out of the King's Troops who lately took Refuge at Benevento, are adjusted by the Del vering them up, excepting four, who were the Pope's own Subjects.
