Bern, August 14, N. S.

IT was proposed in the Council last Friday, to banish the State Prisoners, and all, except two, were led out of Town Yesterday Morning by the Prevots, and permitted to go where they please, out of the Swiss Territories.

Vienna, August 16, N. S. The Emperor, whose Journey for Haulitch had been fixed for Thursday last, is only to set out this Evening, and will be followed by the Empress To-morrow. This little Delay in their Journey was occasioned by an Indisposition of the third Arch-dutcheß Elizabeth, which at first looked like the Small-Pox; but has proved only a slight Fever. Count Puebla set out Yesterday in the Evening for Berlin.

Hambourg, August 22, N. S. Baron Hopken, the Swedish Minister at the Court of Russia, having solicited to be recalled upon Account of the ill State of his Health, the King of Sweden has been pleased to comply with his Request, and has appointed M. de Greiffenheim, who resides at present at the Court of Dresden, to be his Successor.

Brussels, August 25, N. S. Prince Charles of Lorraine returned hither the 22d from Antwerp, extremely pleased not only with the Reception he had met with, but likewise with the good Condition in which he found all the Forts and Fortifications he had been to visit.

Paris, August 27, N. S. Yesterday his Excellency the Earl of Albemarle went to Versailles and had his first Audience of the Dauphin and Dauphiness. This Court has received Advice, that Cape Breton had been delivered to the Commissaries appointed by his most Christian Majesty to receive the same.

Hague, Aug. 29, N. S. General Baron de Burmania, who is named to the Government of Ypres, set out from hence the 26th for Brussels, in order to take the usual Oaths from the Hands of Prince Charles of Lorraine, and proceed from thence to Ypres to take Possession of his Government. Count de Bentinck having received his Instructions, and taken his Leave of the Prince of Orange and of the Members of the Government, set out the 27th for Vienna, to execute the Commission he is charged with at the Imperial Court.
