*St. John's in Antigua, July 28.*

**O**N Saturday last his Excellency General Mathew reviewed the seven Companies of the Honourable General Dalzell's Regiment doing Duty here, at which were present the Hon. Col. Murray, Col. Lessly, Col. Blizard, and many more Gentlemen of Distinction. After his Excellency had reviewed them standing, they performed their manual Exercise; then went thro' their several Firings; and afterwards marched by his Excellency in Companies. His Excellency was pleased to express his Approbation of the good Appearance, as well as Discipline, of the Men; as did all the rest of the Gentlemen present; their Cloaths, Arms and Accoutrements being in thorough good Order; and they having performed their Exercise perfectly well. After which his Excellency, and several of the Gentlemen, were pleased to favour the Officers with their Company to a Dinner provided on that Occasion. A Letter from Barbadoes, dated the 22d of July, mentions, that they had a small Shock of an Earthquake on the 19th Instant, at Half-an Hour after Three o'Clock in the Morning, which lasted about a Minute and a Half.

*Naples, Sept. 30, N. S.* Cardinal Coscia, on his Disagreement with the Court, having had Recourse to the Ecclesiastical Immunity at Rome, and thereby endeavoured to breed a Coolness between the King and the Pope, his Majesty, on the 23d Instant, caused the Delegate of the Jurisdiction to intimate to the Cardinal, that though he had abused his Moderation and Clemency, he would for this second and last time pardon his Disobedience; but that, if his Proceedings should occasion the least Inconvenience between the two Courts, the King would immediately proceed against him, by sequestering his Effects, without admitting any Excuse. The Delegate was charged likewise to intimate to the Cardinal, that he must acknowledge this Insinuation, and cause it to be registred in his Office, and to send a Copy to the Secretary of State's Office. The Prince of Villa Franca, Colonel of the Militia Regiment Royal Palermo, has

been promoted to the Rank of Marshal de Camp, and M. Careu, Lieutenant Colonel, succeeds the Prince in the Command of the said Regiment. The eldest Prince, on Suspicion of the Small Pox, has been sent to Portici. On the 26th Instant died Count Barattieri, Commander of the Castle del Carmine.

*Rome, October 4, N. S.* Upon the many Complaints made by the Merchants at Ancona, of the extraordinary Impositions charged upon the Goods that perform Quarantine in that Lazzeretto, an Edict was published last Week, in order to prevent any future arbitrary Proceedings at that Place. M. Clementi is making the necessary Dispositions for his Departure for Spain, and Cardinal Orfini, it is said, is to succeed him as Minister at this Court from that of Naples. On the 22d the Venetian Ambassador had a publick Audience of Leave of the Pope, on his being recalled: Upon this Occasion he was presented by the Pope, as usual, with the Body of a Saint, a Picture in Tapistry, and two Basons of Agnus Dei.

*Florence, October 10, N. S.* On the 3d M. Okeley, formerly Governor of Grosseto, set out from this City to Pistoia, to take Possession of the Government of that City and its Adjacencies, lately conferred upon him by the Emperor. On the 4th the Emperor's Name Day was celebrated here with the usual Solemnity, the Foreign Ministers, the Nobility, and military Officers, appeared in their rich Habits, several of whom were entertained at Dinner by M. de Richecourt, and in the Evening the usual Fireworks were played off, and the Cannon of the Castles were fired. The same Day Mademoiselle de Ligneville, Daughter to the late General of that Name, was married by Proxy to Prince Calabrita, a Neapolitan. M. de Richecourt, and many of the Nobility, were present at the Ceremony, which was performed by M. Piccolomini, Bishop of Pienza, at one of the Emperor's Country Seats.

*Turin, October 22, N. S.* Last Week died here the Marquis de Riverola, Knight of the Order of the Annunciation, and Governor of Alexandria: His Government is not yet disposed
