Lisbon, September 23.

THE King set out this Morning for the Baths near Caldas, and the Queen proposes to follow his Majesty in a Day or two. M. Joachim Joseph Pareira is appointed Envoy Extraordinary from this Court to the States-General of the United Provinces.

Moscow, October 5. The Weather being yet fine, her Imperial Majesty spends much Time in visiting the principal Monasteries round this Capital; notwithstanding which she has caused the Foreign Ministers to be acquainted with her Resolution of returning to Petersbourg the Beginning of the Winter.

Naples, October 7, N. S. The Secretary at War has sent Orders to all the Governors of the Maritime Towns, to be very watchful of the Corsairs of Barbary, who have been for some Time past meditating a Descent upon our Coasts, and only wait an Opportunity of putting it in Execution; and as we have received Advice that several of their Cruizers are now at Sea, and much interrupt our Commerce, all the Gallies and Warlike Frigates in this Port went out a few Days ago in Search of them. The King has dismissed all the Esclavonian Soldiers which were in his Service, the Time for which they had engaged themselves being expired: Several of them have embarked at Brindisi for their own Country, and the rest have taken the Road for the Ecclesiastical State. Cardinal Spinelli, Archbishop of this City, intends to set out in a few Days for Rome.

Genoa, October 12, N. S. We learn by Letters from Madrid of the 26th of last Month, that his Catholick Majesty had received an Express from Ferrol, with Advice, that a Ship was arrived there from the Havanna, with the agreeable News, that the Fleet from Carthage, under Convoy of four Men of War, commanded by Don Antonia Spinola, was happily arrived there, and would soon proceed on their Voyage to Europe.

Genoa, October 13, N. S. The Count de Maulevrier, Minister Plenipotentiary from his most Christian Majesty to the Infant Duke of Parma, arrived here from Paris the 8th of this Month, and set out the next Day on his Journey to Parma, from whence he will go to Antibes to receive the Infante, who is expected there the 28th. M. Francis Brignole, Senator and ancient Doge, set out a few Days ago for Spezzia, to visit the Fortifications of Sante Marie, the Castle of Porto Venere, the new Fort of Sante Therese, and that of Lerici, and to give the necessary Orders for repairing and putting them in a good State of Defence. The Troubles of this State seem at present a little quieted.

Turin October 16, N. S. The King having resolved to establish a University at Chamberry, for the Improvement of Arts and Sciences, the Ministry are now actually contriving Means for carrying it into Execution. A Courier is ar-

rived here from Madrid, with the King of Spain's Consent to the Marriage of the Infante Donna Marie Antoinette to the Duke of Savoy. The Marquis de la Chetardie, Ambassador from France, is expected here in four or five Days.

Stockholm, October 17. At an extraordinary Assembly of the Senate, which was held a few Days ago, the State of the Forces of this Kingdom was laid before them, by which it appears, that they are all compleat, and in good Condition. The Baron Charles Othon de Hopken has been named by the King to replace the Baron de Greiffenheim at the Court of Saxa, and he will set out in a short Time for that Court.

Vienna, October 18, N. S. Her Imperial Majesty has given Orders for repairing and augmenting the Fortifications of Peterwaradin in Hungary and Olmutz in Moravia; but as the Season is so far advanced, it is thought they will not be begun before next Spring. Count Borck, the Swedish Minister, having received an Express from his Court, immediately waited on Count d'Uhlfeldt, the Great Chancellor, with whom he had a long Conference relating to the Dispositions of his Swedish Majesty for preventing any Disturbances which might happen in the North. The French Minister is often in Conference with the Ministers of State; as is likewise M. de Bentinck, the Dutch Minister, who is much distinguished at Court, and often goes a Hunting with his Imperial Majesty. General Brown left this Place a few Days ago for his Government in Transilvania. Her Imperial Majesty, accompanied by the Princess of Lorraine, came last Sunday from Schonbrun to this City, and assisted at the Marriage of General Count Palfi, with the young Countess of Starenberg, which was celebrated in her Majesty's own Apartments by M. Serbelloni the Pope's Nuncio.

Leipsick, October 18, N. S. Although the Presence of their Majesties, and their Court, with Numbers of Foreign Nobility, made the Fair very brilliant, it has not turned out so much to the Advantage of the Merchants as was expected.

Dresden, Oct. 20, N. S. On the 17th Instant their Majesties, the Prince Royal and his Spouse, with many of the Nobility, arrived here from Leipsick; and it is said his Majesty proposes to set out soon for Warsaw. The young Prince, who had the Misfortune to fall from his Horse as he was Hunting, and was thereby very much bruised, is now in a fair Way of Recovery.

Copenhagen, October 21, N. S. The Anniversary of the Birth of the Dutchess of Saxe Hildburghausen was celebrated Yesterday at Court; and at the same Time a new Ship of War was launched. The Queen's being with Child again having been declared at Court, publick Prayers were put up on the 12th Instant for her Majesty in all the Churches of this City.

Lyons, October 22, N. S. The Infante, Dutchess of Parma and Placentia, who arrived here on the 13th Instant, set out the next Day
