THIS Court has come to a Resolution to have all the Fortifications of this Kingdom repaired, especially those upon the Sea Coast, and even to have some new Works erected. A Resolution has likewise been taken for raising a great Number of Recruits, in order to compleat all our Regiments, which are greatly weakned by Desertion.

Paris, Nov. 10, N. S. This Court has received two Expresses from the Infanta within these few Days, the first of which brought Advice of that Princess's Arrival at Antibes on the 27th past; and the second an Account of her having sailed from thence for Sestri di Ponente.

Dresden, Nov. 10, N. S. The Court is expected here from St. Hubertsbourg by the 23d of this Month; and 'tis said his Majesty intends to set out for Poland towards the Beginning of the Year.

Dusseldorp, Nov. 14, N. S. Count Konigsegg, Envoy Extraordinary from their Imperial Majesties to the Elector of Cologne, passed by here three Days ago on his Way to Osnabrug, where his Electoral Highness has been ever since the 5th of this Month. We hear from Cleves, that the Diet of the Nobles of that Dutchy had been assembled for some Days past, and, according to all Appearance, the Sessions would be of long Duration.

Osnabrug, Nov. 15, N. S. General Count Konigsegg, Envoy Extraordinary from their Imperial Majesties to the Elector of Cologn, arrived here Yesterday, and we expect will be admitted to an Audience of his Electoral Highness this Evening.

Hague, Nov. 19, N. S. By Letters from Leuwarden we are informed of the safe Arrival there of her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange, with the Hereditary Prince, and Princess Caroline, on Saturday last about Noon. The same Letters say, that his Serene Highness the

Prince of Orange arrived there also that Evening; that the Inhabitants seemed greatly pleased at their Arrival; and that every one endeavoured all in his Power to get a Sight of the young Prince. His Serene Highness proposed to set out from thence in a Day or two for Groninguen. Field Marshal Count Maurice of Nassau, who has been to visit the Fortifications of Dutch Flanders, is returned from thence, and has already been in Conference with the President of the Assembly of their High Mightinesses the States General, and other Lords of the Regency. M. Balfour, Major in the Regiment of Lieutenant General Zoute, has taken the Oath to the Council of State, in Quality of Lieutenant Colonel. M. Van Haren, their High Mightinesses Minister Extraordinary to the Court of Bruffels, arrived here on Thursday last from the Castle of Loo, and set out on the 15th in the Morning for Bruffels.
